PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1949 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with triple-front-gabled independent porches on ornamental metal posts and brick piers; original fenestration appears to have been 1:1, but most windows in the front of the house have been replaced; double front doors in the northernmost section of the façade, with an additional front door at the southern end.

RESEARCH


The house was built in 1949 by Frank Gonzales, who with his large family, lived here for the rest of his life. Frank Gonzales was born in Hearne, Texas and worked as a repairman and maintenance man at the State School for the Deaf. His wife, Maria (Mary in the city directories), was born in Mexico. Frank Gonzales died in 1967; Maria Gonzales died in 1980. After a short period of being used as a rental property, one of their sons, Edward, is listed as the occupant in the early 1990s. Edward Gonzales was a carpet installer.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey to date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not have sufficient historical and architectural significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Frank and Mary Gonzales (ca. 1949 – ca. 1979)
Frank and Mary Gonzales appear in the 1930 U.S. Census of rural Travis County, where they rented a house. Frank Gonzales was 25, had been born in Mexico, and is listed as a farmer.

He had immigrated to the United States in 1907. Mary Gonzales was 26, had been born in Mexico, and had no occupation listed. She had immigrated to the United States in 1923. They had a son, Edward, 1, who had been born in Texas.

His 1967 death certificate shows that Frank Gonzales was born in Texas in 1906, and was living at this house at the time of his death. He was a laborer at the Texas State School.

According to the entry in the Find-A-Grave website, Frank "Pancho" Gonzales was born in Hearne, Texas, and Maria Rendon Gonzales was born in Abasolo, Coahuila de Zaragoza, Mexico in 1908.

Papa Pancho age 61 worked for the Texas State School . Along with Mama Maria they had 9 children and lived on Red River, 9th St. and 808 Maude Street. At the time of his death he had 42 grandchildren and 1 great grandchild.
