Why do you want to serve on the Bicycle Advisory Council? I love bicycles and biking. I've been riding throughout my adult life - more than 40 years - and will bring a unique perspective to the advisory committee as a "senior rider." I enjoy cycling for health and recreation and also for utilitarian purposes commuting to my downtown office at Silicon Labs, running errands, and attending events free from the hassles of parking and navigating traffic. As a long-time Austinite and Zilker neighborhood resident, I am deeply concerned about Austin's transportation future. I currently represent Silicon Labs as a board member of Movability Austin, an initiative working in collaboration with the Downtown Austin Alliance to help solve gridlock and parking problems in the downtown district, as well as supporting the city's broader 20/20 Mobility Solutions. Honestly, I am not optimistic that the city will be able to implement comprehensive public transportation modalities such as a citywide light rail system or other "people mover" technologies within a meaningful time frame. Given the funding and political challenges facing light rail, it will be many years if not decades until we have a rail-based system in place. Furthermore, we can't "Uber" (rideshare) our way out of our traffic woes. Ditto for toll roads in and around Austin. And while road infrastructure improvements, as proposed in the forthcoming bond election, will help alleviate some of Austin's crushing traffic, it's not enough. I sincerely believe that if more Austinites used bicycles instead of cars, especially in the downtown/inner city area, we would see a noticeable improvement in our traffic situation. I travel to Europe and Asia often for business and marvel at how prevalent cycling is in great cities like Munich, Amsterdam, Taipei and Beijing. Yes, Austin is a biking town, and there is indeed a strong cycling community here (especially among enthusiasts and competitive racers). But we can do more to enhance Austin's bike commuting scene, much like in Portland and Seattle, which are good urban models. We can do more to encourage biking throughout Austin with the expansion of safe, convenient bikeways and by promoting bike safety and best practices for recreational and commuting cyclists. For these reasons, I am eager to join Austin's Bicycle Advisory Council (BAC) – to share my perspectives and PR/marketing skills, have a voice at the table, serve as an advocate for all types of cyclists, and play a positive role in enhancing Austin's transportation future.

After perusing BAC's bylaws and several recent meeting summaries, I am impressed at the depth of the council's engagement with bikeway planning and implementation. When I have an opportunity to dig deeper into bikeway plans and issues, I am

confident that I will make meaningful contributions to council discussions. Here are a few initial items of interest:

- 1) The completion of the bicycle/pedestrian bridge over Barton Creek and Loop 360 at MoPac and pending extension of a bikeway on the west side of MoPac will provide a much-needed corridor for cyclists living in south and southwest Austin who want to pedal downtown and to central and north Austin. Once the bridges are open, the BAC can do much to promote this new bikeway as a safe and convenient route for cyclists.
- 2) While I am a strong proponent of safe, dedicated bicycle lanes, I believe we should look for cost-effective and innovative ways to create and expand bikeways without necessarily eliminating existing car lanes. This is a very contentious subject. We should remain open to all solutions that ease the testy "bikes vs cars" mentality that is becoming more prevalent in Austin.
- 3) There are too many car-related bike injuries and fatalities in Austin. Even a few such incidents a year is too many. I am very interested in initiatives to promote safe cycling practices as well as helping to educate auto drivers to be more respectful and watchful when it comes to sharing the road with cyclists.
- 4) Austin's B-Cycle bike-sharing program is a success story worthy of expansion. I am intrigued by a pilot program to include e-bikes (electric-assisted bikes) as part of the B-Cycle offering. Easy access to e-bikes (through B-Cycle, other rentals and even private ownership) holds the potential of attracting many new riders who otherwise might not ride due to Austin's hilly terrain and six months of heat.
- 5) I believe we are all aware of what might called "working-class cyclists" a segment of the biking population that remains largely invisible, which includes those who cannot afford cars and who rely on inexpensive bicycles to get around town out of necessity, and even survival.
