PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1936 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame house with a partial-width, front-gabled independent porch; synthetic siding; all the windows have been boarded over.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built in the winter of 1935-36 by Rosa Flores, who lived here for the rest of her life. Rosa Flores was the widow of a farmer who had lived in the Creedmoor section of Travis County. After her death in 1947, the house was a rental property for a short period of time, then owned and occupied by Rosa's son, Primitivo Flores, who lived here until his death in 1970. Primitivo Flores was a driver, laborer, and yard worker during the course of his working life while living in this house. The house then became a rental property through the 1970s and 1980s, and was listed in the early 1990s as having an owner-occupant who worked at a check cashing store.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit. The house has no architectural nor historical significance, and had been modified to the point that documentation is not justified.

Primitivo Flores (ca. 1950 – ca. 1970)


The 1930 U.S. Census shows Bruno and Rosa Flores living in a rented house on the Creedmoor and Manchaca Road in Precinct 6 of Travis County. Bruno Flores was 52, had been born in Texas, and was a farmer. Rosa Flores was 48, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had 4 children: Bicente, 22, a farm laborer, and his wife, Georgia, 23, a farm laborer, and their son, Bicente, 6 months; daughter Concepcion, 21, a farm laborer; son Santos, 19, a farm laborer; and son Primitivo, 17, a farm laborer. All of the children had been born in Texas.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Rosie Flores as the owner of this house (which is mis-labeled as 805 Jewell Street); the house was worth \$835. Rose Flores was a 55-year old Texas-born widow with no occupation listed. She had lived in rural Travis County in 1935. With her lived 3 of her children: daughter, Chonita, 31, a housekeeper in a private home; son Santos, 29, a laborer for a lumber company; and son Primitivo, 28, a laborer for a construction company. Also

in the household were a daughter-in-law, Georgia, a 34-year old widow who did housework in a private home, and 5 grandchildren: Vincente, 10; Robert, 9; Julian, 7; Elida, 6; and Anita, 2.

According to her 1947 death certificate, Rosa C. Flores was born in Texas in 1894 and was living in this house at the time of her death. She was a widowed homemaker.

Primitivo Flores' 1970 death certificate shows that he was living in this house at the time of his death at the VA Hospital in Temple, Texas. He was born in 1912 in Buda, Texas and had never married. He was a laborer and had served in World War II.
