PROPOSAL

Demolish a house that was either moved to this site or built ca. 1951.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame house with single and paired 1:1 fenestration; partial-width, front-gabled entry porch on ornamental metal posts; attached one-bay garage.

RESEARCH

City building permits indicate that this house was moved from 607 W. 5th Street in the winter of 1951-52, but there is considerable doubt that this is the house (or any portion thereof) formerly located at 607 W. 5th Street, which was a two-story house. Architecturally, this house gives every indication that it was built on-site in 1951.


The first owners and occupants of this house were Lee and Lucille Williamson, who lived here until around 1954. Lee Williamson was a city police officer. In the mid-1950s, the house was owned and occupied by James and Julia Nelson; he was in the Air Force and she worked as a saleslady for the telephone company. Joseph and Agnes Mayfield owned and occupied the house in the late 1950s; he worked on the Shell pipeline. From around 1961 until around 1974, the house was owned and occupied by Milas and Erna Dyer in their retirement. Milas Dyer was an Austin native and had retired from the Post Office. The house has been a rental property since the mid-1970s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

It is more likely that the building permit does not reflect the actual conditions at this site – and that this house was built from scratch in 1951 rather than a portion of the two-story house that used to be

located at 607 W. 5th Street.

BIOGRPAHICAL NOTES:

Milas and Erna Dyer (ca. 1960 – ca. 1974)

Miles [sic] P. Dyer appears in the 1900 U.S. Census as the 4-year old son of Elbert and Laura J. Dyer who lived in an un-numbered house on Rio Grande Street. Miles was born in Texas. His father, Elbert, was 33, had been born in Tennessee, and was a water and gas engineer. The

family rented their house. His mother, Laura, was born in Texas to Scottish-born parents, and had no occupation listed. Miles had a younger sister, Annie.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Milas and a Myrtle Dyer living in a rented house in Justice Precinct 6 of Travis County. Milas Dyer was 24, had been born in Texas, and was the manager of the telephone exchange. Myrtle Dyer was 21, had been born in New Hampshire, and had no occupation listed. They had no children listed with them.

Her 1974 death certificate shows that Erna Katherine Dyer was in a nursing home, but claimed this house as her address. She was born in 1895 in Fayette County, Texas, and was a homemaker.

MILAS DYER Milas Dyer, 73, of 1506 Kinney Avenue, died Thursday in a C local hospital. He had been a lifelong resident of Austin and Travis County and was a member of Congress Avenue Baptist Church. He was retired employe of the Post Office and was a member of the National Association of Retired Civil Employées. International Brotherhood Magicians, and Travis Post No. 76 of the American Legion Survivors include his wife Erna S. Dyer, Austin; two daughters, Mrs. Edna Earl Johnson, and Mrs Erin Katherine Flemister, both of *Austin: one son Belton Di Miller, Houston; one sister, Mrs. Glenn Hardin, Marble Falls: three brothers, Willard Dyer and Lucien Dyer, both of Austin, and LeRoy Dyer, Luting: and a number of grandchildren and greatgrandchildren. 


