PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, wing-and-gable plan, minimal traditional frame house with a fixed-sash picture window in the wing section of the façade, flanked by multi-light casement windows; 6:6 fenestration elsewhere; shed-roofed independent entry hood.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1948 by local builder Hawes Campbell. The first owners and occupants were Herbert and G. Barbara Beadle, who lived here from the late 1940s through the early 1980s. Herbert Beadle was born in Pennsylvania, and was the proprietor of a confectionary in Del Rio, Texas in 1940, although it appears that his true vocation was as a highway engineer. The 1930 U.S. Census shows Herbert and Geraldine (Barbara) Beadle living in Victoria, Texas, where he worked as a civil engineer for the State Highway Department. While living in this house, Herbert Beadle was an engineer for the State Highway Department in Austin. G. Barbara Beadle was a music teacher, who also played in the Austin Symphony. After Barbara's death in 1977, Herbert Beadle continued to live here until the early 1980s. In his later years, he was living in Atlanta, Georgia, but was buried in Austin upon his death in 1993.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey to date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house appears to be in very good condition and every consideration should be given to adaptive re-use on site, as this house represents the post-World War II architecture of this Ridgelea neighborhood.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Herbert J. and G. Barbara Beadle (ca. 1948 – ca. 1983)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Herbert J. and G. Barbara Beadle living in a house they owned in Del Rio, Texas. Herbert J. Beadle was 42, had been born in Pennsylvania, and was the proprietor of a retail confectionary. G. Barbara Beadle was 44, had been born in Connecticut, and was a music teacher at her house. They had a son, Herbert Beadle, Jr., 16, who had been born in Connecticut, and had no occupation listed. With them lived G. Barbara's mother, Fannie Deintz, a 65-year old Connecticut-born widow with no occupation listed.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Herbert J. and Geraldine B. Beadle living in a rented duplex in Victoria, Texas. Herbert J. Beadle was 32, had been born in Pennsylvania, and was a civil engineer for the state highway department. Geraldine B. Beadle was 33, had been born in Connecticut, and had no occupation listed. Their son, Herbert, Jr., was 6, and had been born in Connecticut. With them lived Geraldine's mother, Fannie O. Deintz, 59, who had been born in Connecticut and had no occupation listed.

Her 1977 death certificate shows that Geraldine Barbara Beadle was born in Waterbury, Connecticut in 1895, and was living in this house at the time of her death. She was a musician with the Austin Symphony.
