## PROPOSAL

Demolish a house of unknown age that was moved to this site in 1956.

## ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house, sited lengthwise on the deep, narrow lot; single 1:1 fenestration.

#### RESEARCH

The house was moved from 515 Vargas Road, the current site of Laura Allison Elementary School, in 1956, but city directories prior to 1961 do not list any houses on this eastern end of Pennsylvania Avenue. It is not clear if the house was originally intended as a duplex, but was being used as one by the mid-1960s. J.D. and Nettie Hilliard were the first known occupants of the house, and are later shown as occupants of one unit of a duplex. They lived here until around 1966. He was a housefather and custodian at the Brown Schools. The building has since had a series of blue-collar African-American or Hispanic tenants.

## STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey to date.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, but release the permit. The house does not qualify as a historic landmark, but is a unit of affordable housing that should be maintained if possible.


#### J.D. and Nettie B. Hilliard (ca. 1960 - ca. 1966)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows J.D. Hilliard as the 17-year old step-son of Johnnie Bean, and his wife Pearl, of Weimar, Texas, where they owned their house. J.D. Hilliard was born in Texas and is listed as a new worker. His mother, Pearl Bean, 30, was a Texas-born farm laborer. His step-father, Johnnie Bean, 34, had been born in Texas and was a section hand on the steam railroad.

J.D. and Nettie B. Hilliard were married in August of 1956 and divorced in 1979 in Travis County.

**HILLIARD, J.D.**, 88, retired custodian, of Austin died Sept. 23. Services 11 a.m. Monday, Springdale Church of God in Christ. Burial Paradise Garden Cemetery, Weimar. Arrangements by Pendergrass-People's, Smithville.
