### PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1941 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, front-gabled bungalow-style frame house with a partial-width front-gabled independent porch on brick piers; single and double 1:1 fenestration.

### RESEARCH


The house appears to have been built around 1941 by R.D. and Nellie Moore, who lived here until around 1946. R.D. Moore was a painter. Wilburn Stewart, a trucker and teamster, and his wife, Glendene, owned and occupied the house in the late 1940s. Bertha White, a clerk, rented the house in the early 1950s, followed by Mary McClintock a seamstress at the Capitol Casket Company across the street. Comer and Myrtle Cathey rented the house in the 1960s – he was a dairy worker.

### STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey to date.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, as the house appears to be in good condition, and can still serve as a unit of affordable housing, either on- or off-site. However, the house lacks the required historical and architectural significance to be designated as a historic landmark, so staff recommends release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:**

### Comer and Myrtle Cathey (ca. 1962 – ca. 1970)

The 1930 U.S. Census shows H. Comer and L. Myrtle Cathey living in a tent in the Ector County Oil Field in Ector County, Texas. H. Comer Cathey was 25, had been born in Texas, and was a truck driver in the oil field. L. Myrtle Cathey was 22, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a son, Orval, 5 months, who had been born in Texas.

Her 1981 death certificate shows that Myrtle Boyd Cathey was born in 1908 in Texas, and was living at 601-A Nelray Boulevard in Austin at the time of her death. She was a housewife.

CATHEY, Mrs. Myrtle, 72, 601-A Nelray, died Monday. Services 11:30 a.m. Thursday at Hyltin-Manor Funeral Chapel. Burial, Austin Memorial Park. Survivors: husband, Comer Cathey of Austin; son, Arvil Cathey of Austin; daughter, Evelyn Lalonde of Sunset, La.; brother, Charlie Boyd Sr. of Austin; four grandchildren.
