PROPOSAL

Demolish the remains of a ca. 1928 house.

ARCHITECTURE

Only the rear walls remain of this ca. 1928 house, which was a front-gabled frame bungalow before it collapsed during a heavy rain.

RESEARCH

The house was built around 1928 by Andrew and Mary Banks, who lived here for the rest of their lives. Andrew Banks had no occupation listed in the city directories of the 1920s and 1930s, but it appears that he and Mary operated a grocery at 2300 E. 14th street in the early 1930s for a short period of time. The 1947 city directory shows Andrew Banks as a porter. Mary Banks worked as a maid at a sorority house on the UT campus after Andrew died in 1949. She retired in the mid-1960s, and died in 1987.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is listed in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984) but without a priority for research.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Andrew and Mary Banks (ca. 1928 – ca. 1987)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Andrew and Mary Banks as the owners of the house at 1147½ Northwestern Avenue; that house was worth \$1,100. Andrew Banks was 49, had been born in Texas, and was a teamster for a lumber company. Mary Banks was 47, had been born in Texas, and was a maid for a fraternity house. They had no children listed with them.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Andrew and Mary Banks living in a rented apartment at 2009 Whitis Avenue in Austin. Andrew Banks was 40, had been born in Texas, and was a laborer in a lumber yard. Mary Banks was 39, had been born in Texas, and was a servant in a sorority house. They had no children listed with them.

Andrew Banks' 1949 death certificate shows that he and Mary were living at 1147½ Northwestern Avenue in Austin at the time of his death. He was born in 1890 in Littig, Texas, and was a porter. There was no obituary in the Austin newspapers.

BANKS, Mary, 96, of Austin died Tuesday. Services were Saturday Ebenezer Baptist Church. Burial Evergreen Cemetery. (Fuller-Sheffield)




