PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1946 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, front-gabled stuccoed frame house with a modified front-gabled entry vestibule; single and paired 6:6 fenestration.

RESEARCH

This house, like the house at 917 W. James Street, was built by local builder Chester Kitchens in 1946. The first owners and occupants were Joseph and Alice Dalley, who lived here until around 1948. Joseph Dalley was a student while he and Alice lived in this house. Reynolds and Arline Bixler rented this house in the late 1940s before moving next door to 917 W. James Street. Reynolds Bixler was the manager of the Grand F&W Silver Store, a department store, on Congress Avenue. A U.S. Army man is listed as the owner of the house in the 1952 city directory. From the mid-1950s onward, the house has been a rental property, with tenants including the proprietor of a café, a salesman, a construction worker, a produce salesman, and a city park ranger.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey to date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, as the house represents post-World War II residential patterns in the city, and also represents a unit of affordable housing, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Reynolds and Arline G. Bixler (ca. 1948 - ca. 1950)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Reynolds B. and Gwendolyn Bixler as the renter of a house in Dallas, Texas. Reynolds B. Bixler was 27, had been born in Oklahoma, and was the manager of a grocery store. He had lived in Elmer, Oklahoma in 1935. Gwendolyn Bixler was 22, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a son, Reynolds, Jr., 11 months, who had been born in Texas.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows R.B. Bixler as the 17-year old son of Thomas C. and Edith Bixler of Pittsburg, Texas. R.B. Bixler had been born in Oklahoma and had no occupation listed. His father, Thomas C. Bixler, 43, had been born in Louisiana, and was a cashier and operator at the railroad station. His mother, Edith Bixler, 42, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed.

Reynolds Bixler died February 19, 1998 in Houston, Texas.

Otto and Mozelle Lehnick (ca. 1957 – ca. 1960)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Otto W. and Letha O. Lehnick as the renters of a house in Randall County, Texas. Otto W. Lehnick was 41, had been born in Texas, and was a farmer.

Letha O. Lehnick was 34, had been born in Texas, had had no occupation listed. They had 3 children: Audrey J., 14; Curtis A., 12; and Edward L., 9. All of the children had been born in Texas.

His 1971 death certificate shows that Otto William Lehnick was born in 1898 in Bastrop, Texas, and was living at 2309 S. 1st Street in Austin at the time of his death. He was a widower who worked as a cook at the Elks Club. He is buried in the Lehnick family cemetery in Bastrop County.

Mrs. Mozzeile J. Lehnick, of 2309 South First, died Friday in a local hospital.

She had been a resident of Austin and Travis County for the past 13 years and was a member of the Baptist church.

Survivors include her, husband, Otto Lehnick of Austinand one son, Gene Cole of Liberal, Kans.

Funeral services are Sunday at 2 p.m. at the Chapel of the Wilke-Clay Funeral Home with Rev. A. D. Eberhart, pastor of the Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, officiating.
