PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1951 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, side-gabled, brick veneered house with a front-gabled independent porch on ornamental metal supports; multi-light metal-framed casement windows.

RESEARCH


The house was built in 1951 by local contractor Howard Pringle. The first owner and occupant of the house was a widow, who lived here until around 1955. Around 1960, the house was purchased by Frank G. and Sarah Louise Owens, who lived here through the 1990s. Frank G. Owens was a native of Missouri who moved to Austin from El Paso in 1949 to work for Wesley Pearson, who had a service station and an auto- and boat-seat cover manufacturing company. Frank Owens was the manager of Tru-Fit Boat Seats, owned by Wesley Pearson, until he retired in 1981.


STAFF COMMENTS

STAFF RECOMMENDATION


Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, as the house represents post World War II residential development in Austin. However, the house does not qualify as a historic landmark as it lacks the necessary architectural and historical significance, so staff recommends release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.
