PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1961 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, stone-veneered frame side-gabled house with single 2:2 horizontally-configured fenestration and an extended eave over the front door.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1961 by local developer Clarence Flournoy, as was the house at 3607 Grant Street, also up for demolition. The owners and occupants of this house were Lee D. and Pearlie Davis, who lived here for the rest of their lives. Lee D. Davis was first a utility man for the State Highway Department, but around 1970, took over the "legendary" White Swan club on E. 12th Street. Pearlie Davis was the sister of Floyd Carrington, who built the house at 3607 Grant Street also in 1961, and who operated another club on E. 12th Street at the same time as the Davises owned and operated the White Swan.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey to date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. While the house does not appear to meet the qualifications for landmark designation, it was the home of the owner of the White Swan, a local African-American nightclub and fixture of the music venues on the E. 12th Street corridor for many years.
