PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1939 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-and-a-half story, side-gabled frame Cape Cod-style house with front-gabled dormers and single, paired, and triple 6:6 fenestration; attached garage was built in 1986.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1939 by Trenton and Rosalie Rieth, who lived here until around 1943. Trenton Rieth was a native of Louisiana, and was a salesman for a wholesale food company; he later became a life insurance agent. Edith Vernon, a spinster public school teacher, and her sister, May Vernon, another spinster public school teacher, owned and occupied the house in the mid-1940s. From around 1946 until around 1950, the house was owned and occupied by C.B. and Merle B. Murrah. C.B. Murrah was in the insurance business while living in this house. His 2004 obituary states that he was a director of the Texas State Board of Insurance, from which he retired. From the early 1960s through the mid-1970s, the house was owned and occupied by Herndon and Sharon Bailey. Herndon Bailey was a civil engineer. He and Sharon divorced in 1976. The house was a rental property in the 1980s, and then purchased by a professor at the Episcopal Theological Seminary; she lived here in the 1990s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use; this house is a very good example of late 1930s Colonial Revival residential architecture, and appears to be in good condition. It would also be contributing to a potential historic district in Rosedale. If the house cannot be re-used on-site, then staff recommends relocation over demolition, but release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Trenton and Rosalie Rieth (ca. 1939 – ca. 1943)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Trenton and Rosalie Rieth as the owners of this house, which was worth \$6,000. Trenton A. Rieth was 39, had been born in Louisiana, and was a salesman for a wholesale food company. Rosalie Rieth was 35, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. The Rieths had lived in Lockhart, Texas in 1935. They had a lodger, Zeta Drew, 30, a Texas-born divorcee who had lived in Denver, Colorado in 1935, and was a saleslady in a retail dry goods store.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Trenton Rieth as a single roomer living in San Angelo, Texas, where he was a salesman for a bakery.

Trenton Rieth died in New Orleans in 1974. Rosalie Rieth died in 1992.

Edith Vernon (ca. 1943 – ca. 1946)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Edith Belle Vernon as a lodger in the home of Beulah Cannon at 2100½ San Gabriel Street in Austin. Edith Belle Vernon was 44, single, and had been born in Texas. She was a public school teacher.

According to her 1961 death certificate, Edith Belle Vernon was living at 2311 Rundell Place at the time of her death. She had been born in 1894 in Fate, Rockwall County, Texas, and was a teacher and librarian for the Austin public schools. She had never married. May Vernon was her sister.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Boyd and Merle Murrah living in a house they owned in Los Angeles Heights, a suburb of San Antonio, Texas. Boyd Murrah was 28, had been born in Texas, and was a book-keeper for an insurance company. Merle Murrah was 31, had been born in Texas, and was a public school teacher. They had no children listed with them.

Her 1976 death certificate shows that Merle B. Murrah was living at 1805 Palma Plaza at the time of her death. She had been born in 1907 in Denton, Texas, and had no occupation shown on the certificate. She died at Scott & White Hospital in Temple, Texas.


