PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1950 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, side-gabled stone-veneer house with a combination of single and paired 1:1 fenestration, and a plate glass picture window with multi-light casements flanking it; partial-width inset porch.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1950, although the address is not listed in the 1952 city directory. Tom D. McKenzie, who had his real estate office in this house, is listed as the owner and occupant from the early 1950s through the mid-1970s. The house has been a rental property since that time.

STAFF COMMENTS




The house is not listed in any City survey to date.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. While a good, albeit modest example of post-World War II International-style residential design, the house lacks the requisite significance for designation as a historic landmark.
