Good morning,

For those of you who don't know me, I work with architectural reviews in Travis County, including review of proposed work to Recorded Texas Historic Landmarks. Brad Jones shared your email with me so that I could address the Texas Historical Commission's role in review of RTHLs. I greatly appreciate your concern regarding the state designation and am happy to confer at any time on projects where we have overlapping oversight.

Generally speaking, most RTHL designations cover a single building rather than a complex of buildings, and our review is of the exterior of that building only, not the interior, grounds, or associated archeology. In the case of the Stanley House, the application materials do not mention the stone shed, and while there is a photo of it included in the file, that is not enough for us to infer that we have jurisdiction over the shed. Subdivision and rezoning of the property and relocation of the shed does not require THC review. I would be happy to convey this directly to the property owner if you can share his or her contact information, or you are welcome to forward this message.

If you would like to read more about RTHL review, there is an <u>overview on our website</u>, and the rules for this program are at <u>Texas Administrative Code</u>, <u>Title 13</u>, <u>Chapter 21</u>, <u>Rule 21.11</u>. The file for the Stanley House is scanned on the <u>Portal to Texas History</u>.
