

Background

2002 Safe Riders Distribution

APH Neighborhood Centers partnered with Safe Riders led by Texas Department of State Health Services to provide Child Passenger Safety Classes and car seats to economically challenged parents.

2006 Fitting Stations Begin

APH Injury Prevention Program and Neighborhood Services at St. John entered an agreement with Safe Kids -Austin led by Dell Children's Medical Center to provide car seat education and installation to the public.

2007 Safe Kids Partnership Expands/ Neighborhood Centers Invest in Fitting Station Infrastructure

The partnership expanded to include Safe Riders participants. The first Neighborhood Center staff person became a Certified Child Passenger Safety Technician giving Neighborhood Services the capacity to become a monthly Fitting Station for economically challenged parents.

• 2008 Fitting Stations Go Mobile

Neighborhood Services added Blackland, South Austin, Rosewood-Zaragosa and East Austin Neighborhood Centers as well as 3 new Child Passenger Safety Technicians.

• 2010 Neighborhood Services Increases Capacity

Mobile Fitting Stations include Montopolis Neighborhood Center. Neighborhood Services invests in car seat inventory and provides storage facilities for all seats including those donated by Dell Children's. There are 5 full-time staff with Child Passenger Safety Certifications, one of these obtained Senior Technician Certification.

Highlights / Accomplishments

2007-2008

 \checkmark Increased the number of children served by 200%.

2008 - 2010

 Invested in staff, goods and services that allowed Neighborhood Services to run and maintain its Mobile Fitting Stations independent of Safe Kids Coalition oversight.

2010 – present

- Austin Public Health is a major contributor to providing motor vehicle safety education and car seats to families in Austin / Travis County with:
 - Approximately 900 seat checks
 - More than 700 seats distributed
 - At least 50 Mobile Fitting Stations staffed
