


### PROJECT OVERVIEW: PHASE ONE

- Texas Facilities Commission is developing Phase One of the 2016 Texas Capitol Complex Master Plan
- \$581 million State investment in the revitalization of a public space
- Phase One includes the construction of:
  - □ a pedestrian-oriented "Texas Mall"
  - two new office buildings to be located at 1601 and 1801 North Congress Avenue
  - an underground parking garage below North Congress Avenue, extending from 16<sup>th</sup> Street to Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard
  - a Central Utility Plant expansion at the existing Sam Houston State Office Building located at 201 East 14<sup>th</sup> Street
  - new underground utility tunnels extending from the Central Utility Plant expansion to the new building at 1801 North Congress Avenue
  - underground utility installations and relocations in support of the Project




# PROJECT OVERVIEW: FUTURE PHASES (TWO AND THREE)

- Capitol Complex Project: Phase Two
  - ☐ Renovation of the 4<sup>th</sup> Block of Texas Mall
  - ☐ Two new State Office Buildings (approx. 500k new SF)
- Capitol Complex Project: Phase Three
  - ☐ Two new State Office Buildings (approx. 500k new SF)



# PROJECT OVERVIEW: PHASE ONE PACKAGING

 Phase One will be executed through six separate design and construction packages and sub packages.







# PROJECT SCHEDULE: PHASE ONE – PACKAGE ONE



#### **STATE ASKS**

- Expedited process
- Waiver of utility tunnel easement and right-of-way usage fees
- Conversion of 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, and 18<sup>th</sup> Streets to two-way
- Vacation and conveyance of Congress Avenue and 17<sup>th</sup> Street Right-of-Way in the project area



#### STATE ASKS: EXPEDITED PROCESS

- Assignment of a City of Austin project team to coordinate all City responsibilities for the project and ensure continuity
- Ensure that review, inspection, and processing of all aspects of this project are a priority
- Allow specialized sequencing of work on a per package basis
- Allow participation in the General Permit Program




#### STATE ASKS: WAIVER OF EASEMENT AND USAGE FEES

- Estimate: \$6.9M
- Fee types include:
  - ☐ Utility Tunnel Easement Fees
  - ☐ Right-of-Way Usage Fees



#### STATE ASKS: TWO-WAY CONVERSION

- Conversion of 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, and 18<sup>th</sup> Streets to two-way
- Traffic lights, signage, and pavement striping to be modified
- Will be implemented prior to closing Congress to cross traffic
- Site Improvements (internal to site and/or primarily driven by project traffic):
  - \$775,000 two-way conversion of 16<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> St. and a new signal at Colorado and MLK
  - \$1,300,000 four internal signals and new turn lanes (future project phase)
- System Improvements (external to site and/or shared by non-project traffic)
  - \$740,000 two signals and lane upgrades (future project phase)
  - COA & TFC proportionate cost share



#### STATE ASKS: CONGRESS AVENUE VACATION

- Vacation and conveyance of Congress Avenue and 17<sup>th</sup> Street Right-of-Way in the project area
- Texas Government Code §2166.052 provides for vacation of right-of-way for a "reasonable value"
- Heritage trees have been identified within this boundary and are planned for removal



# PROJECT CONSIDERATIONS

- Expedited process
- Waiver of Easement and Usage Fees: \$6.9M
- Two-way Conversion: Proportionate Cost Share of System Improvements
- Congress Avenue Vacation/ Tree Impacts: To be determined



#### **NEXT STEPS**

- June 22, 2017: Authorization to negotiate an interlocal with the Texas Facilities Commission
- Future date: Return with a negotiated interlocal
