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Additional Backup Information

This item is part of the 2016 Mobility Bond. On October 31, 2013 and again on October 30, 2015, flood waters severely damaged Fallwell Lane and threatened Austin Energy's substation, Sand Hill Electrical Center's raw water intake structure, and Austin Water's South Austin Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant in the area east of SH130. Onion Creek flood waters inundated low areas as they flowed into the Colorado River. Bank erosion was severe and extensive restoration and stabilization is required. Temporary measures have been put in place to allow local traffic to utilize Fallwell Lane. A permanent solution to reconstruct or realign key access roads, retrofit water intake structures, and stabilize berms and channels to guard against flood overflows from Onion Creek is needed to protect critical City infrastructure from future flood events.

The anticipated services for this project include collecting information to evaluate a range of improvement concepts which include:

- Analyzing costs and benefits of various solutions,
- Identifying a list of recommended improvements and their estimated costs,
- Preparing a schedule to implement proposed improvements; and
- Identifying other potential funding sources.

The selected consultant will develop construction plans for the option selected by the City to either reconstruct or realign Fallwell Lane, retrofit the raw water intake structure, and stabilize the Colorado River bank and protect against flood overflows from Onion Creek. The selected consultant will also provide preliminary, design, bid, construction, and warranty phase services.

Fallwell Lane is critical for access to both of the above mentioned City of Austin facilities and to private property. A delay in approval of this item could lead to restricted access to these sites during flood events.

This authorization provides for funding of the above listed services. This request allows for the development of an agreement with the qualified responder that Council selects. If the City is unsuccessful in negotiating a satisfactory agreement with the selected responder, negotiations will cease with that provider. Staff will return to Council so that Council may select another qualified responder and authorize contract negotiations with that provider.

The project area is within the City of Austin's Council District 2.
