## Subject

Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance setting the assessment rate and approving the certified 2018 assessment roll for the East Sixth Street Public Improvement District. Related to Item # 2.

## Amount and Source of Funding

The East Sixth Street Public Improvement District (PID) submitted a 2018 budget for the PID in the amount of \$157,426. The amount includes \$89,380 in 2018 assessments (at a 90% collection rate); \$35,000 annual contribution in-lieu of paying an assessment on City-owned tax exempt property by the City of Austin; \$3,046 interest accrued in the PID account and late payments; and \$30,000 from the East 6th Street Public Improvement District Fund. Appropriation of the \$157,426 in the Economic Development Department Special Revenue Fund will require City Council Authorization and possible adjustment, after the assessment roll hearing on August 10, 2017.

Additional Backup Information

This action will approve the proposed East Sixth Street Public Improvement District Service and Assessment Plan and Budget for 2018, as provided to the City by 6ixth Street Austin. State law requires City Council approval of the Service and Assessment Plan and Budget, which serves as the basis for the certified assessment roll. The PID assessment will provide services in the following categories: Infrastructure and Physical Environment; Public Safety; Communications and Membership, and; Marketing, Fundraising and Economic Development.

The total projected revenue is \$157,426. This estimate is based on the real property certified appraisal roll from the Travis Central Appraisal District (TCAD). Adjustments to the roll may be required based on new information from TCAD and Council action as a result of the August 10, 2017 public hearing. Approval of the proposed PID service and assessment plan and budget and the ordinance adopting an assessment rate and certified assessment roll are the first steps in the annual process of approving PID assessments and subject through City Council approval in the FY 2018 Budget.
