Additional Backup Information					

The contract is for the purchase of a replacement aircraft rescue firefighting (ARFF) apparatus that will be housed at the fire station located at the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA). The apparatus is an all-wheel drive diesel powered unit capable of holding water, foam concentrate, and dry chemical for the purpose of passenger and aircraft rescue options. The purchase of this apparatus is driven by the last inspection by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Due to the age and condition of one of the existing units, the FAA expressed concerns about the reliability of that unit and suggested replacement to ensure sufficient units were available. ABIA currently has four ARFF units in-service. This contract will increase the number back to five units.

This purchase is made in accordance with the applicable requirements of the National Fire Protection Association 414 (2017 Edition) Standard for ARFF apparatuses, as adopted by FAA Advisory Circular 150/5220-10E Guide Specification for ARFF apparatus.

The Houston-Galveston Area Council cooperative establishes competitively bid contracts that can be utilized by the State and other government agencies through a cooperative agreement. Cooperative agreements save taxpayer dollars by leveraging the State's volume-buying power to drive down costs on hundreds of contracts through a streamlined cooperative purchasing program.

If a contract is not secured, ABIA could be vulnerable to flight reductions/interruptions if one of the remaining units is placed out of service. FAA requirements dictate the applicable and required ratio of ARFF units to number of commercial flights.
