

## **RESOLUTION NO.**

**WHEREAS**, on May 23, 2013, the Austin City Council approved Resolution No. 20130523-074, which declared the second Saturday in August as Barton Springs Fest to be celebrated at Barton Springs and provides for free admission to Barton Springs until 2 p.m. on that day; and

**WHEREAS**, Barton Springs Fest was a successful day of celebration and learning at Barton Springs; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 6, 2015, the Austin City Council approved Resolution No. 20150806-046, which moved the Barton Springs University teaching and learning component of Barton Springs Fest as a pilot project to Friday, September 18 of that year; and

**WHEREAS**, the goal of this pilot project was to avoid conflicts with the summer weekend crowd and allow for more participation in Barton Springs University sessions by students, educators, and citizens interested in outdoor learning; and

**WHEREAS**, free admission to Barton Springs was moved from Barton Springs Fest, the second Saturday in August, to Barton Springs University, in late September, in order to lower the amount of lost Barton Springs gate revenue while increasing the educational value of the Barton Springs University sessions to the Austin community; and

**WHEREAS**, the pilot Barton Springs University learning sessions were taught by experts and leaders from the City of Austin's Watershed Protection Department, Parks and Recreation Department, City Council and leading experts

from other governmental agencies, educational institutions, and the private sector; and

**WHEREAS**, the pilot Barton Springs University project successfully increased participation in outdoor learning for students, educators, and citizens, with approximately 450 high school students attending, which increased to approximately 700 students in its second year in 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, the continuation of Barton Springs University as an independent annual event will sustain outdoor learning in Austin for years to come and provide a basic literacy in water resources, freshwater ecosystems, and water policy for Austin area students and the general public; and

**WHEREAS**, the date for this year's Barton Springs University has been set for Tuesday, September 26, 2017; and

**WHEREAS**, learning sessions at Barton Springs University are planned to run from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on that day, with City of Austin experts again leading several of the learning sessions; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

The Austin City Council proclaims Tuesday, September 26, 2017 as Barton Springs University Day, with a rain date of Friday, September 29.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

The Austin City Council supports Barton Springs University Day, a day of learning at Barton Springs to be held on Tuesday, September 26, 2017 and open to the general public with emphasis on enabling Austin area high school and college students to learn from experts about the science, policy challenges, and historic and

cultural aspects of Barton Springs, the Edwards Aquifer, and the waters of central Texas.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

That admission to Barton Springs Pool on the date of Barton Springs University Day shall be free.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:**

The Austin City Council appreciates and encourages the continued participation and cooperation of Austin Parks and Recreation, Watershed Protection, and Austin Water Utility staff in working with Save Our Springs Alliance, the University of Texas Environmental Science Institute, Austin Independent School District, Barton Springs Edwards Aquifer Conservation District, Save Barton Creek Association, and others to make the 2017 Barton Springs University Day event a successful day of outdoor learning and fun at Barton Springs.
