- Laundry, kitchen, work out room space etc




LOCKER ROOM PROJECT PHASES

- 2012 Bond Election
- Austin residents voted Yes
- Oldest and most complicated
- Most active

- Inequity causes a rift in team structure
- Lives depend on that team structure
- All for lives of Austin Residents



CALL TO ACTION
