Goals

Amend Title 8.—Parks and Recreation to:

- Clearly define terms used in relationship to the use of Alcohol in Parks
- Clearly state where alcohol is permitted
- Fairly and equitably regulate the use of alcohol within the park system

Round Table Discussions on the Issue

PARD held round table discussions

- July 19, 2017: Technical focused, PARD Grounds, APD, Park Rangers
- July 25, 2017: Community Representatives

Executive Committee of Austin Neighborhood Council; representatives from Galindo, Zilker, Govalle, University Hills Neighborhood Associations, Keep Austin Beautiful, Austin Parks Foundation, Pease Park Conservancy, Zilker Botanical Center Conservancy, Downtown Austin Aliance, and Vice Chair of the Parks Board

- Among the Technical Group: Unanimous support to be consistent with prohibiting alcohol in parks.
- Among the Community Representatives: There was a split between the language of: "No alcohol in parks" versus "No public consumption of alcohol in parks."

Staff Recommendations

- 1. Staff recommendation is to prohibit alcohol on public recreation areas with some exceptions.
- 2. These exceptions include:

Rental facilities by permit (wedding venues, cultural centers, etc.)

Contracted concession sites

Designated event and picnic facilities by permit

Athletic fields except dugout and playfield

Rented campsites

Golf courses

Special Events

Other areas as designated by the director

8-1-1 Definitions

Current:

APPROVAL means a permit, reservation agreement, or other written document that evidences an authorization by the department.

PUBLIC RECREATION AREA means a park, recreational facility, athletic field, building, swimming pool, playground, nature preserve, trail, dock, or greenbelt managed, maintained, or operated by the department or on the department's behalf.

SPECIAL EVENT means an activity that anticipates 1,000 or more attendees and is conducted pursuant to an approval that allows for the exclusive use of all or part of the public recreation area for the activity.

Clarification will be needed for: Designated Event Facilities Playing field area and dugout Designated Rental Sites

8-3-1 Alcoholic Beverages Prohibited

Current Code Language

Except as provided in <u>Section 8-</u> <u>3-5</u> (Temporary Sales of Beverages and Food), a person may not knowingly sell, possess, or consume an alcoholic beverage in

- the fenced, enclosed area surrounding a swimming pool in a park, or within 100 feet of an unenclosed swimming pool in a park;
- a recreation facility or adjacent outdoor area that is part of the recreation facility including a field, playground, parking lot, play slab, or playscape;
- all or part of a park or playground designated by the director as being an area in which the sale, possession, or consumption of alcohol is prohibited;
- the playing area or dugout area of an athletic field;
- a school district/playground area; or
- a nature preserve.

8-3-1 Alcoholic Beverages Prohibited

Exemptions

Proposed Code Language

Prohibit alcohol on public recreation areas unless listed as an exemption
