ORDINANCE NO. 20171005-029

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 2-2 RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE AND ELECTION FUNDRAISING TIME PERIODS; AND CREATING AN OFFENSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

- **PART 1.** Subsection (4) of City Code Section 2-2-2 (*Definitions*) is amended to read:
 - (4) CAMPAIGN PERIOD means the time period allowed in City Charter Article III, Section 8 (*Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures*) and Section 2-2-7 of this chapter.

PART 2. City Code Section 2-2-7 (*Commencement of Campaign Period*) is amended to read:

§ 2-2-7 COMMENCEMENT OF CAMPAIGN PERIOD.

- (A) A general election, special election, and [a] runoff election each have a separate campaign period[s] for purposes of City Charter Article III, Section 8 (Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures) and this chapter.

 The contribution limits set forth in City Charter Article III, Section 8 (Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures) apply separately to each general election, runoff election, and special election.
- (B) The campaign period for a general election begins the 365th day before the date of the general election.
- (C) [(B)] The campaign period for a runoff election begins the day after the date of an <u>election</u> [Election] at which no candidate receives the majority of the votes.
- (D) [(C)] The campaign period for a special election, including a recall election, begins the day after the date the council calls the special election.
- (E) An unsuccessful candidate may only solicit or accept political contributions after an election to the extent authorized by City Charter, Article III, Section 8 (Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures), Subsection (F)(4).

- (F) An officeholder may only solicit or accept political contributions after an election to the extent authorized by City Charter, Article III, Section 8 (Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures), Subsection (F)(5).
- (G) [(D)] A candidate may only raise funds for an election during an authorized campaign period.

PART 3. This ordinance takes effect on October 16, 2017.

Amend City Code § 2-2-2 (DEFINITIONS) as follows:

CAMPAIGN PERIOD means the time periods allowed in <u>Section 2-2-7</u>. City Charter Article III, Section 8 (Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures)

Amend City Code § 2-2-7 (COMMENCEMENT OF CAMPAIGN PERIOD) as follows:

- (A) A general election, special election, and a runoff election each have a separate campaign period for purposes of City Charter Article III, Section 8 (*Limits on Campaign Contributions and Expenditures*) and this chapter. "Per election" in City Charter, Article III, Section 8 means the contribution limits in the Charter apply separately for a general election, special election, and a runoff period.
- (B) The campaign period for a general election begins 365 days before the date of the general election.
- (1) For candidates who win a general election, the general election campaign period ends after they pay off their remaining extant campaign debt and fund their officeholder account, or 180 days after the general election, whichever occurs earlier.
- (2) For candidates who lose a general election, the general election campaign period ends when they pay off their remaining extant campaign debt.
- (C) The campaign period for a runoff election begins the day after the date of an Election at which no candidate receives the majority of the votes.
- 1) For candidates who win a runoff election, the runoff campaign period ends after they pay off their remaining extant campaign debt and fund their officeholder account, or 180 days after the runoff election, whichever occurs earlier.
- 2) For candidates who lose a runoff general election, the runoff campaign period ends when they pay off their remaining extant campaign debt.
- (DC)The campaign period for a special election, including a recall election, begins the day after the date the council calls the special election.
- (1) For candidates who win a special election, the special election campaign period ends after they pay off their remaining extant campaign debt and fund their officeholder account, or 180 days after the general election, whichever occurs earlier.
- (2) For candidates who lose a special election, the campaign period ends when they pay off their remaining extant campaign debt.
- (E) A contribution applies to the campaign period during which it was accepted.
- $(F \underline{E})$ A candidate may only raise funds for an election during an authorized campaign period.
