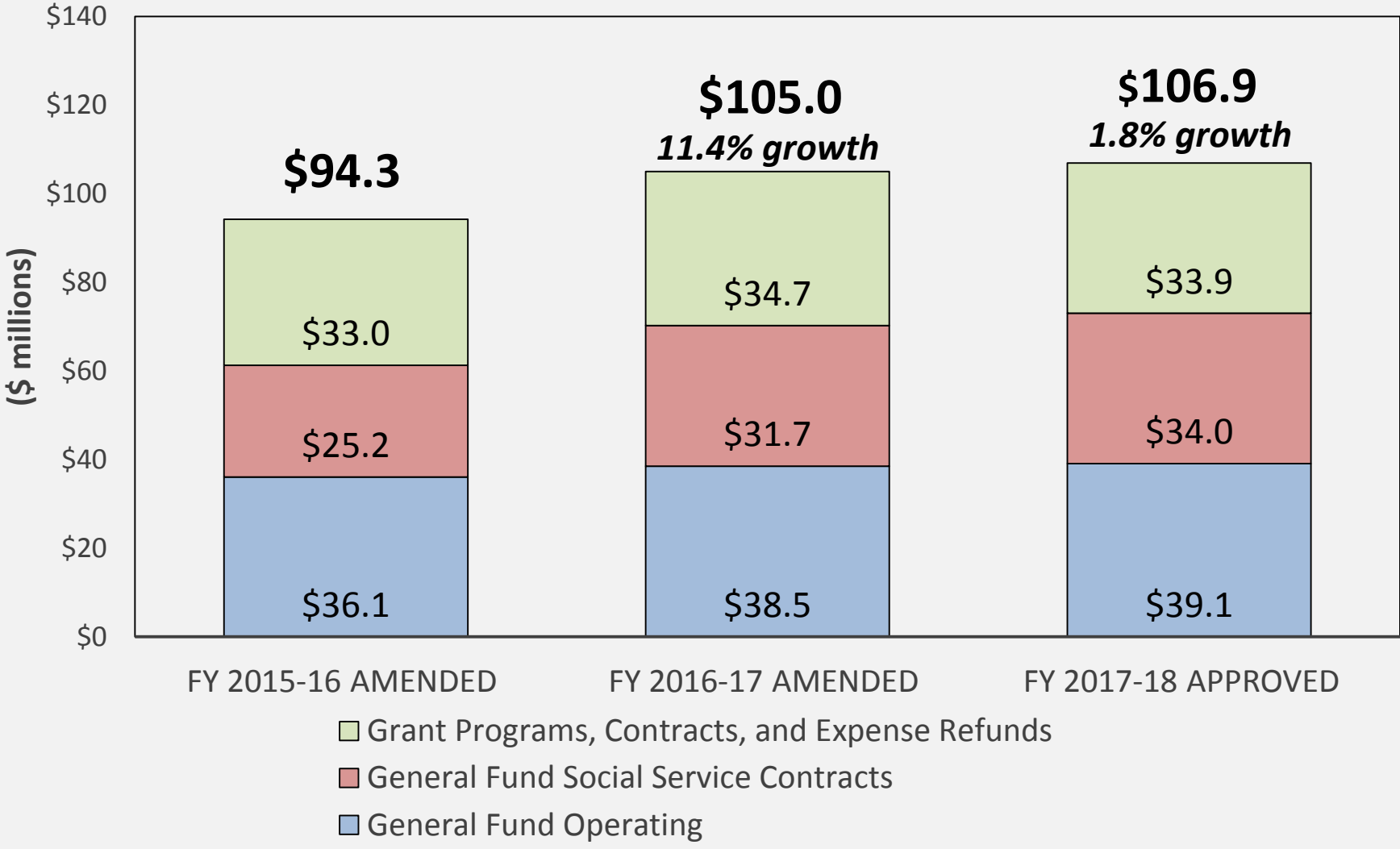

Department Overview

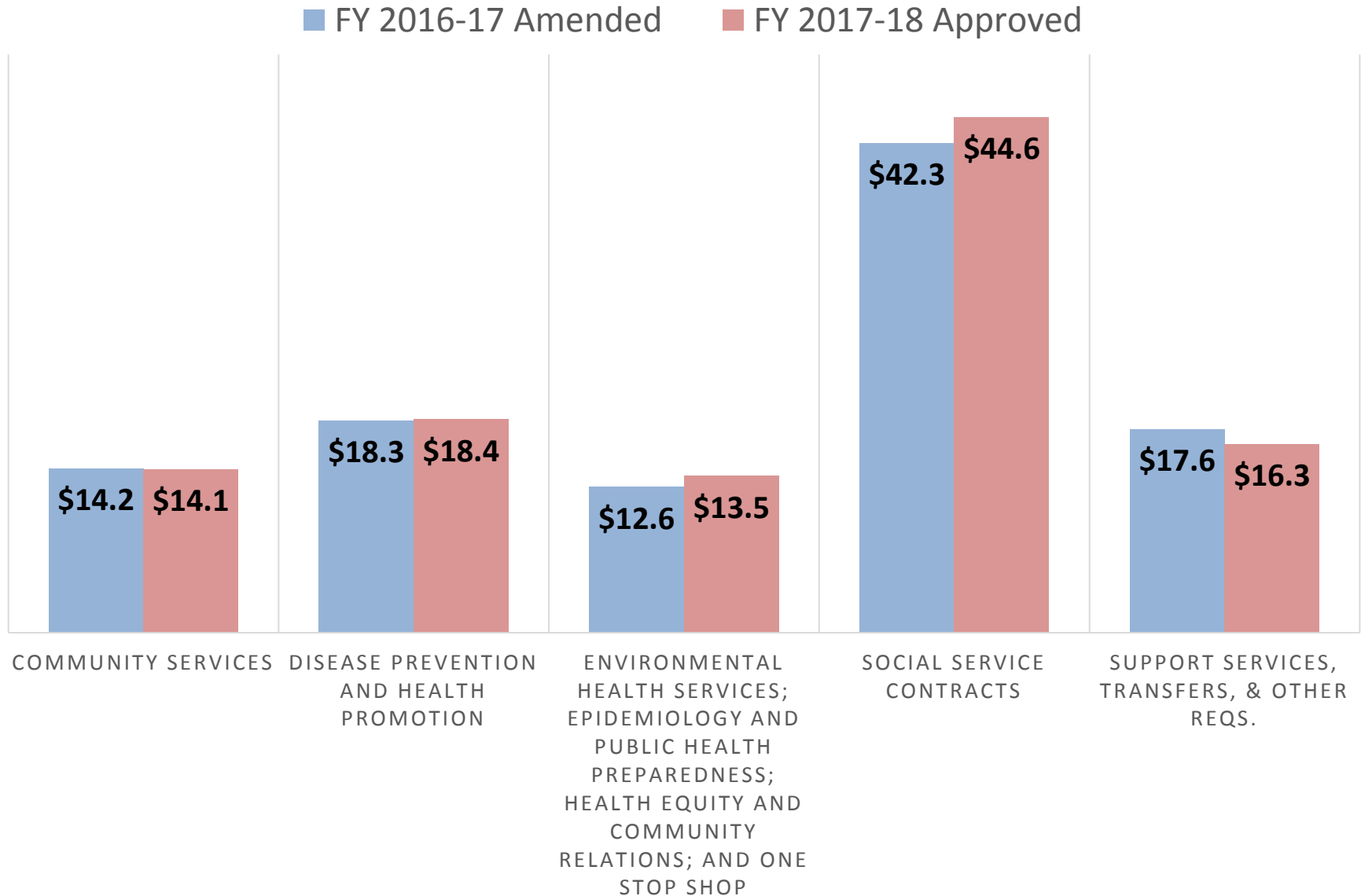
Budget comparison and position count

Personnel Changes

Transferring funding and 2.5 positions for the Youth and Family Services Office from the Human Resources Department to Austin Public Health.	\$405,010
One IT Systems Administrator position transferred to Communications and Technology Management.	(\$111,675)
One new Accounting Associate II position being funded with personnel reorganization.	\$0
Elimination of two grant positions	\$0

Council Resolutions

- Resolution No. 20160128-068 adopted a formal policy goal of additional funding within 2-4 years plus annual cost escalators
 - Investing \$12.0 million for social service contracts
 - Investing \$10.3 million for the Health and Human Services Department
 - \$1.8 million for inflation and population growth in FY18
- *Outcome: \$2.6 million added in FY18*
 - \$2.2 million for social service contracts
 - \$0.4 million for Health operating
