HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION OCTOBER 23, 2017 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2017-0606 1200 HASKELL STREET

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1919 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, hipped-roof frame house with a partial-width inset porch on plain, square, wood posts; single 6:6 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1919, and was a rental property until purchased by Arvid B. and Emma Peterson, who lived here from around 1925 until Emma Peterson passed away in 1972. Arvid B. Peterson was the son of Swedish-born farmers, and worked as a shade maker for Swann-Schulle Furniture Company on Congress Avenue until the mid-1930s. He was a rug cleaner and then a painter in the late 1930s, then went to work for the University of Texas as a watchman and building attendant; he worked in this capacity until his retirement in the early 1960s. After Arvid died in 1965, Emma Peterson continued to live in this house until her death in 1972. The house appears to have been a rental property since that time.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house was listed with no priority for research in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984). The East Austin Historic Resources Survey notes that the doors have been replaced on this house, but that the house is recommended as contributing to the potential South East Austin local or National Register historic district. The house is shown with a red circle in the map below.

SOUTH EAST AUSTIN




Staff has reviewed the house with reference to the landmark designation criteria as set forth in City Code, and has determined that the house does not qualify as an individual

historic landmark, as it does not meet two of the criteria as required. Staff believes the house qualifies under the criterion for architecture, but no other:

- a. **Architecture.** The ca. 1919 frame house is a vernacular example of middleclass housing, and retains a high degree of integrity.
- b. **Historical association**. The owners with the most significant association with this house, Arvid and Emma Peterson, do not appear to meet the criterion for significant historical associations.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
- e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not appear to meet the threshold for designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Arvid B. and Emma I. Peterson (ca. 1925 - ca. 1972)

Arvid B. and Emma I. Peterson appear in the 1930 U.S. Census as the owners of this house, which was worth \$2,000. Arvid B. Peterson was 35, had been born in Texas to Swedish-born parents, and was an interior decorator for a furniture company. Emma I. Peterson was 28, had been born in Tennessee to Texas-born parents, and had no occupation listed. They had a son, Windom W., $4\frac{1}{2}$.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Arvid B. and Emma Peterson as the owners of this house, which was worth \$2,300. Arvid B. Peterson was a 44-year old Texas-born owner of a home service company. Emma Peterson, 38, had been born in Tennessee, and had no occupation listed. Their son, Windom W., was 14.

His 1965 death certificate shows that Arvid Bengt Peterson was born in 1894 in Travis County. He was living in this house at the time of his death. He was retired from the University of Texas, and was a veteran of World War I.

Emma Ida Peterson died in 1972; she listed this house as her last address. She was born in 1901 in Tennessee, and was a widowed retired homemaker.

ARVID PETERSON

Arvid B. Peterson, 71, of 1200 Haskell Street died Saturday in a local hospital. He was a retired employe of The University of Texas.

Survivors include the widow; son, Windom W. Peterson, Austin; sister, Mrs. Carl A. Johnson, Corpus Christi; and brother, Elof W. Peterson, Elgin.






