

AUSTIN CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING THURSDAY, OCTOBER 19, 2017

Invocation: Reverend Madeline Hawley, St. Christopher's Episcopal Church

The following represents the actions taken by the Austin City Council in the order they occurred during the meeting. While the minutes are not in sequential order, all agenda items were discussed. The City Council of Austin, Texas, convened in a regular meeting on Thursday, October 19, 2017 in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 301 West Second Street, Austin, Texas.

Mayor Adler called the Council Meeting to order at 10:18 a.m.

CONSENT AGENDA

The following items were acted on by one motion.

- 1. Approve the minutes of the Austin City Council work session of October 10, 2017, and regular meeting of October 12, 2017.
 - The minutes from the City Council work session of October 10, 2017 and regular meeting of October 12, 2017 were approved on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on an 11-0 vote.
- 2. Authorize the negotiation and execution of a cost participation agreement with the Austin Community College District for the City to reimburse the Austin Community College District for an amount not to exceed \$1,460,660 for costs associated with the design and construction of an oversized wastewater main and appurtenances related to Service Extension Request No. 3145 that will provide wastewater service to a proposed mixed-use development located at 5900 Airport Boulevard.
 - This item was postponed indefinitely on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on an 11-0 vote.
- 3. Authorize award and execution of a construction contract with AAR, INC. for the Flood Hazard Mitigation Buyouts Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity in the amount of \$2,000,000 for an initial two-year term, with two one-year extension options of \$500,000, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$3,000,000. (Note: This contract will be awarded in compliance with 49 CFR Part 26 (Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program) by meeting the goals with 10.00% DBE participation.). District(s) Affected: District 1, District 2, District 3, District 4, District 5, District 6, District 7, District 8, District 9, District 10.
 - The motion authorizing award and execution of a construction contract with AAR, Inc. was approved on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on a 10-1 vote. Council Member Troxclair voted nay.

4. Authorize the use of the design-build method of contracting in accordance with Texas Government Code Chapter 2269 for design and construction services for the Austin Fire Departments Locker Room Project Phase 6: Stations 2, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 16. (Note: MBE/WBE goals will be established prior to issuance of this solicitation.) District(s) Affected: District 3, District 5, District 7, District 9, District 10.

The motion authorizing the use of the design-build method of contracting in accordance with Texas Government Code Chapter 2269 was approved on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on an 11-0 vote.

5. Authorize additional contingency funding for the construction contract with Spawglass Contractors Inc., for the Animal Center Kennel Addition and Campus Infrastructure Improvements Project in the amount of \$50,000 for a total amount not to exceed \$6,808,000. (Note: This change order will be awarded in compliance with City Code Chapter 2-9A (Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). Current participation to date is 4.96% MBE and 5.80% WBE.). District(s) Affected: District 3.

The motion authorizing additional contingency funding for the construction contract with Spawglass Contractors Inc. was approved on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on an 11-0 vote.

6. Approve first reading of an ordinance relating to the 2015 International Property Maintenance Code and local amendments.

City of Austin, Cause No. 03-15-00370-CV in the Third Court of Appeals, Austin in an amount of \$44,000 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$96,875.

The motion authorizing negotiation and execution of an amendment to the legal services agreement with Max Renea Hicks was approved on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on a 10-1 vote. Council Member Troxclair voted nay.

14. Approve a resolution to be submitted to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs by the Austin Geriatric Center, Inc., or an affiliated entity, supporting an allocation of low income housing tax credits for the rehabilitation and new construction of senior housing units at the Rebekah Baines Johnson Center, and acknowledging that the City has more than twice the state average of units per capita supported by low income housing tax credits or private activity bonds at the time of application. District(s) Affected: District 3.

Resolution No. 20171019-014 was approved on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on an 11-0 vote.

15. Authorize negotiation and execution of an encroachment agreement with 405 Colorado Holdings, L.P., a Delaware limited partnership for the aerial encroachment of right-of-way by a proposed canopy and building structure at the intersection of West 4th Street and Colorado Street, located at 405 Colorado Street. District(s) Affected: District 9.

The motion authorizing negotiation and execution of an encroachment agreement with 405 Colorado Holdings, L.P. was approved on consent on Council Member Flannigan's motion, Council Member Houston's second on an 11-0 vote.

16. Authorize negotiation and execution of a contract with GateKeeper Systems, Inc., to provide a ground transportation management system, for a term of three years in an amount not to exceed \$310,000. (Sole source contracts are exempt from the City Code Chapter 2-9D Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

For the services required for this procurement, there were no subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established.).
