SUBJECT:	Council Resolution No. 20170202-046 Parkland Events Task Force - Implementation Update

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide Council with an update on the implementation of the recommendations detailed in the final report of the Parkland Events Task Force (PETF).

On March 5, 2015, the Austin City Council adopted Resolution No. 20150305-025, which effectively created the seventeen member task force and its scope of work. PETF's final report recommendations were adopted by City Council on January 26, 2017. On February 2, 2017, the City Council passed Resolution No. 20170202-046 and directed the City Manager to implement the recommendations. The Parks and Recreation Department was assigned as the lead department and worked with several other City departments to implement the recommendations.

In August 2017, an update to Council from City staff committed to offer follow-up meetings to collect additional input regarding the four recommendations. In October 2017, City staff requested and coordinated meetings with four City Council offices who were interested in offering additional input.

Recommendation Topics the Included Additional Council Input

- 1. Co-sponsorship evaluation
- 2. Damage deposit waivers
- 3. Ticket acceptance policies
- 4. Inclusion of Long Center events into limits established for Auditorium Shores

Feedback Collected from Meetings

- Events should work toward financial sustainability
- Accountability for grant-funded events should be clearly stated within event contract
- Events should be held accountable regarding event goals
- An expense report should be submitted for grant co-sponsorship
- Ensure an equitable process and accessibility for fee waivers

While the feedback was meaningful, currently there is insufficient consensus for the creation of an additional ordinance or resolution. The items mentioned above will be placed on hold at this time.

Other Remaining Action Items

The Austin Parks and Recreation Department has completed all park administrative and ordinance changes that are not dependent on additional funding. The remaining items for consideration can be aggregated into two categories:

- 1. The following are highlights of items needing budgetary/bond consideration:
- Citywide Event Fee Study
- Citywide Event Economic Impact Study
- Master planning and/or development funding for alternative spaces
- 2. The items that are currently under the purview of partner City departments include:
- Special Event Ordinance Adoption
- Special Event Parking Program
- Parking Fine Increases in Event Impact Zone

• Budgetary Requirements Highlights

C1 - Encourage events to utilize green event policies.

• <u>Funding required for recommended expansion to implement a certification and/or expanded</u> <u>program scope.</u> (Austin Resource Recovery)

C2 - Protect trees, vegetation, and environmentally sensitive areas.

- <u>As budget allows, an additional Forestry Inspector FTE will be requested</u>. (PARD Forestry)

E2 – Create incentives for the relocation of events at Zilker Park, Vic Mathias Shores, and Fiesta Gardens that do not require the entire space to other venues to help minimize the impact and closure of streets.

• <u>Funding and program policy elements will require Council consideration</u>. It is recommended that incentive development occur after funding is appropriated for alternative park development funding. (PARD)

The program shall be established with focus on increased fines for parking, changes to City procedure and practice to encourage effective towing or booting authorization and ticketing by non-sworn personnel. City staff shall pilot the program no later than the fall of 2016.

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




