# **Distribution of Exterior Container Decals to Private Haulers**

The Universal Recycling Ordinance (URO) administrative rules require service providers to label exterior containers, such as dumpsters, used for collection of trash and recyclable or organic materials. To minimize the financial burden of the new labeling requirement and help ensure consistency, ARR made an administrative decision during the development of the URO to provide exterior container decals to haulers for free for a limited time.

Given that the URO has been in effect for over 5 years, staff will cease the distribution of free decals over the next 6 months. Such action will reduce ARR expenditures by \$40,000 per year.

Haulers will be able to purchase decals meeting Administrative Rule specifications from the vendor of their choice. ARR will provide design specifications and other information to assist haulers to meet the requirements. ARR will notify registered waste haulers of this change by email and will limit the number of decals each company can receive while remaining supplies are being distributed.

### **Bulk "On-Call" Pilot**

ARR is launching an "On-Call" Bulk pilot with a planned start date of spring 2018. Customer Service survey data indicates that customers would prefer to have more bulk collections that the currently schedule two. The pilot will involve two, separate bulk routes which represent the demographics and disposal patterns of the City. Citizens may call up to three times to request collection of bulk items.

The pilot will run until December 31, 2018 and have dedicated field crews to provide collection. Routes chosen to participate will be temporarily removed from the Bulk route calendar and returned to the twice-per-year collection schedule when the pilot is completed.

Currently, ARR is only able to divert tires from the bulk routes as most items are scavenged before crews can collect. During the pilot, ARR will divert the following items for recycling: appliances,

electronics, tires, and metals. Remaining bulk items will be landfilled.

Staff will collect data during the pilot on material types collected including tonnages and frequency of use and will provide ZWAC with a detailed presentation after the pilot has concluded and data analyzed.

## **Department Director Staff Changes**

Gabriel Gonzalez recently joined the Office of the Director as a Research Analyst. He holds a Business Administration degree in Economics from Texas State University, and has prior experience providing analytic support as a temporary employee within ARR. Gabriel is responsible for Public Information Requests, Council Action Forms, and Zero Waste Advisory Commission support on behalf of the department.

Additionally, Theresa Cruz is now in the position of Department Executive Assistant. Theresa transferred from the City Clerk's office and brings a professional and supportive disposition to the Office of the Director. Though she has been providing ZWAC support in an interim role, her primary responsibility will be support of the Director.

### **Actions Taken by City Council**

At the February 1, 2018 City Council meeting, item 68 read as follows:

Approve a resolution initiating a benchmarking study comparing Austin Water and Austin Resource Recovery to other Texas utilities and developing recommendations concerning Affordability Standards for both city-owned utilities.

The resolution was amended and approved, directing staff to collect public and private (when available) service rates in order to create affordability goals to assist Council in future decision making.

# ARR Requests for Information (RFI) scheduled to be issued in the next 30 days:

Reuse Product Sorting Services: Sorting, collection data, and diverting household chemicals deemed
by the City to not be reusable or recyclable through the existing process. New service derived from a
nine month pilot program in which ARR was able to divert an additional 27,000 pounds of material that
would have otherwise been disposed of.


### **Definitions:**


