### **Parks and Recreation**

Authorize negotiation and execution of a 25-year Parkland Improvement and Joint Access Agreement, with one 25-year renewal option, with YMCA of Austin for parking improvements located at Lamar Beach in Town Lake Metropolitan Park, in an amount not to exceed \$375,000.

### **Additional Backup Information:**

The YMCA of Austin owns and operates an exercise and recreational facility located at 1100 W. Cesar Chavez St. This facility is adjacent to parkland, Lamar Beach at Town Lake Metropolitan Park.

The Parks and Recreation Department and the YMCA desire to construct an approximately 100-150 parking space facility on the west side of B. R. Reynolds Drive, on parkland, as contemplated by the Council approved Lamar Beach Park Master Plan, for the mutual benefit of the City and YMCA. The proposed parking facility will serve to benefit citizens participating in park activities and recreational activities supported by both the City and the YMCA on this property.

In addition, the City desires to lease approximately 0.75 acres of land owned by the YMCA for the purpose of licensing this area to Austin Pets Alive (APA) for the development of new facilities to replace the existing facilities located at Lamar Beach at Town Lake Metropolitan Park. This animal facility relocation is also consistent with the Council-approved Lamar Beach Park Master Plan. APA contracts with the City for the City purpose of finding homes for stray animals.

The estimated construction cost for the parking facility is approximately \$920,000. The City will contribute up to \$375,000 from Parks and Recreation Department's Capital Budget for construction costs. The YMCA will be responsible for covering the remaining balance of all the construction costs as well as being responsible for one-half the cost of all annual maintenance associated with the parking facility.
