- Authority and Provider Roles






Overview







Programs and services offered




Services provided In FY17




Locations with direct services and mobile teams




FY18 Staffing



Integral Care and City of Austin Partnership

City of Austin Investment \$9,314,014

- Interlocal Agreement
 - Every \$1.00 invested by City of Austin ensures ability to draw down dollars from State of Texas
 - Supports Administration and Authority functions and infrastructure for service delivery, community planning and resource development to address gaps and needs
- HIV Services
- Homelessness and Housing
 - Wraparound rehabilitation supports for clients in Permanent Supportive Housing
 - Bond funds to build 50 additional housing units
 - Homelessness Outreach Street Team collaboration
 - Assertive Community Treatment team (1115 Waiver project)
- Substance Use Disorder through Downtown Austin Community Court
- Youth Services (Community Development Block Grant funds)



Integral Care Innovation



Expanding Access and Outreach

- Eastern Crescent Planning
 - Proposed expansion in Colony Park near county resource center
 - Proposed expansion at Community First! Village
- Interstate 35 Corridor Construction
 - Collaboration with TxDot, City and County to engage individuals living in and around underpasses along Interstate 35
- School Based Counseling Services
 - Austin, Del Valle, Pflugerville, Manor Independent School Districts expansion through HB13
- RA1SE first episode psychosis multi-prong intervention for ages 15-24
 - 82% retention rate in first year
- Outreach to diverse communities including materials in Chinese and Vietnamese and basic website in 15 languages

Integral Care

Mental Health First Aid training – expanded opportunities with new grant funds

Housing and Homelessness

- Homelessness Outreach Street Team (HOST)
 - Integral Care, Austin Police Dept. & Emergency Medical Services
- Assertive Community Treatment Team
 - Housing and Intensive Wrap around supports for individuals using the most services
 - 1 year savings for 109 people = \$1.08 million
 - 30% reduction in ER usage = \$476,000
 - 55% reduction in CH funded inpatient services = \$385,000

Housing as a health intervention

- Housing First Model
- 450 in housing
- 50 additional units under construction





Strengthening Diversion

- Forensic Assertive Community Treatment (FACT) Senate Bill 292
 - 90 individuals to be served with housing for 60
 - Collaboration with City of Austin, Travis County and Central Health
- Expanded Mobile Crisis Outreach Team co-responds with Law Enforcement and Emergency Medical Services
 - 3,244 Dispatches by 911 last year
 - More partnerships with additional police departments and other law enforcement agencies
- Judge Guy Herman Center for Mental Health Crisis Care
 - Receives emergency detentions from Austin Police Dept. and other law enforcement



Tackling Opioids

- Expanded office based opioid treatments for easier access
 - Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) pilot with CommUnityCare funded through Community Care Collaborative to create access through primary care physicians
 - Narcotic Treatment Program (NTP) methadone and suboxone program serving 345
- Prescribing Practices changes to reduce the risk of addiction and accidental death
- Naloxone
 - training and kit distribution to reverse overdoses
 - 7 reported reversals in 3 months





24/7 Crisis Services

Helpline Upgrade to handle more calls

- 54,340 crisis calls answered
- 48,025 follow-up calls
- Answering all suicide hotline calls for our area beginning January 2018

Urgent Care 7 days/week


- 7,472 crisis visits
- New updated location with separate waiting rooms for families with children

Mobile Crisis Outreach Teams

- 2,085 Dispatches by Helpline
- Up to 90 days of follow-up post crisis



- Homelessness and Housing

 - Wait lists for opioid treatment
- Children's Crisis Services
- Transition to 1115 Medicaid Waiver 2.0



What's Next for Integral Care

- Certified Community Behavioral Health Center (CCBHC)
- Expansion of Dell Medical School partnership including Substance Use Disorder Institute
- Redevelopment of the Austin State Hospital
- Bring 50 additional units of housing with an onsite clinic and rehabilitation services online in 2019
