Community Development Commission (CDC)

Community Development Commission Mission Statement

RECOMMENDATIONS TO CITY COUNCIL

Recommendation regarding a contingency fund to protect CSBG grant-funded programs – Recommendation 20170711-05

On July 11, 2017, the CDC approved a recommendation regarding the creation of a contingency fund to protect services provided under CSBG grant-funded programs.

Recommendation regarding the Mayor's Task Force on Institutional Racism Recommendations – Recommendation 20170808-03

On August 8, 2017, the CDC approved a recommendation regarding suggested modifications to CodeNEXT.

<u>Recommendation regarding the Citizen Participation Plan – Recommendation 20171010-03c</u>

On October 10, 2017, a recommendation was approved in support of the proposed changes to the City of Austin Citizen Participation Plan.

<u>Recommendation regarding COA land acquisition – Recommendation</u> 20171212-03b

On December 12, 2017, the CDC unanimously approved a recommendation in support of COA land acquisition, policies and priorities that support the Austin Independent School District's Vision for the Future Facility Master Plan for affordable housing.

<u>Recommendation regarding COA land acquisition – Recommendation 20171212-05</u>

On December 12, 2017, the CDC unanimously approved a recommendation on affordable and fair housing concerns related to CodeNEXT.

<u>Recommendation regarding revision of CDC Bylaws –</u> Recommendation 20180109-03a

On January 9, 2018, the CDC unanimously approved a recommendation in support of staggered terms, member removal, and financial disclosure statements in the revision of the CDC bylaws, and approval of directing the City Council Housing and Planning Committee to select the 7 CDC members representing the public and private sectors with consideration to achieve full district representation of the City Council districts.

Recommendation regarding CodeNEXT- Recommendation 20180321-05

On March 21, 2018, the CDC approved a recommendation regarding the inclusion of affordability tools in CodeNEXT on a 6-0-2 vote. Commissioners Deshotel, Paup, Singer, Hinely, Fadelu and Zamora voted in favor of the recommendation. Commissioners Delgado and Tolliver were off the dais, and Commissioners A. Villalobos and Taylor abstained.

Approval of the Fiscal Year 2017 – 18 Draft Action Plan

On July 11, 2017, the CDC approved the Fiscal Year 2017-18 Draft Action Plan, recommending that the plan be forwarded to City Council for approval.

Approval of the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) proposed Fiscal Year 2018 Budget and Community Action Plan

On October 10, 2017, the proposed CSBG Fiscal Year 2018 Budget, and the Community Action Plan were approved unanimously with the amendment that future CSBG Fiscal Year Budgets and Community Action Plans better reflect the needs and provide services across the community of Austin.

Selection of a Housing Committee member

On November 14, 2017, Commissioner Delgado was selected as a Housing Committee member.

Selection of a Joint Sustainability Commission appointee

On November 14, 2017, Commissioner Fadelu was selected as the Joint Sustainability Commission appointee.

Selection of CodeNEXT Working Group

On December 12, 2017, the CDC approved a motion to appoint Commissioners Paup, R. Villalobos and Hinely to serve on the CodeNEXT Working Group.

Selection of CodeNEXT/AISD Facilities and Land Use Working Group

On December 12, 2017, the CDC approved a motion to appoint Commissioners Dailey, Delgado and Zamora to serve on the CodeNEXT/AISD Facilities and Land Use Working Group.

Selection of 2018 Housing and Health Bond Program Working Group

On December 12, 2017, the CDC approved a motion to appoint Commissioners R. Villalobos, Hinely and A. Villalobos to serve on the 2018 Housing and Health Bond Program Working Group.

Approval of Revisions to the CDC Bylaws

On January 9, 2018, the CDC unanimously approved APH staff's recommendation for staggered terms, member removal, and financial disclosure statements in the revision of the CDC bylaws, and approved directing the City Council Housing and Planning Committee to select the seven CDC members representing the public and

private sectors with consideration to achieve full district representation of the city council districts.

All actions of the CDC throughout the year complied with their mission statement.

3. List the board's goals and objectives for the new calendar year.

- a. Advise Council on tools to support the Homestead Preservation District(s), with emphasis on preservation of existing affordable housing stock and deep affordability (60% MFI and lower).
- b. Encourage a more "regional" approach to delivery of human services, especially to underserved areas where a physical site doesn't exist; research and advise City Council on a plan to enhance service delivery to the poor who lack access to a physical site.

- c. Where appropriate, encourage City/County partnerships in order to enhance delivery of services to the poor.
- d. Austin Strategic Housing Plan: Make recommendations on affordable housing plans, including unique funding mechanisms, strategies and revenue streams.
- e. Advise Council on, and grow the list of, outreach strategies to promote City-funded and grant-funded programs to the public, and seek more community involvement. Function as an advocacy group to empower and engage the citizens the CDC represents.
- f. Continue to monitor and make recommendations on Tenant Relocation Policy to include mobile home residents.
- g. Monitor and make recommendations on affordable housing incentive programs such as Vertical Mixed Use, Community Land Trust, Multi-family 6 and others to be determined.
- h. Facilitate filling vacant seats on the CDC.
- i. Explore and provide recommendations to Council on how public housing can help to solve Austin's affordability crisis.
- j. Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH): Work with City staff to ensure that the goal of adding 400 new PSH units by 2019 is accomplished.
- k. Monitor and make recommendations on ending homelessness, including helping to address the "downtown puzzle" and permanent supportive housing.
- 1. Make recommendations to City Council regarding *sustainability* in affordable housing, in terms of mitigating environmental impacts and making building code improvements to produce measurable energy efficiency outcomes (like the "passive house" model).
- m. Require and monitor quarterly reports on function and productivity of all affordable housing programs from NHCD staff.
- n. Monitor and make recommendations on CodeNEXT.
- o. Develop a study investigating the scope and scale of residential displacement and evictions in Austin.
- p. Monitor and make recommendations regarding the City's 2018 Bond Election.

CITY PLANNING INITIATIVES

- **<u>Downtown Austin Plan</u>** Continue to receive briefings, monitor the plan, and complete work as directed by Council.
- <u>University Neighborhood Overlay (UNO)</u> Continue to work with the Planning Commission to forward recommendations as directed by Council.
- East Riverside Corridor Plan The CDC will continue to monitor and participate in the development on this corridor plan especially as it pertains to the development of affordable housing.
- <u>Holly Good Neighbor Program</u> Continue to work on the charge to discuss the future funding of the Holly Good Neighbor Program, how funds might be reallocated; and how to educated residents about the program.
- Rainey Street Subdistrict Continue to work to initiate amendments to the City Code that are necessary to ensure affordable housing in the Rainey Street Subdistrict.
