Economic Development Department

The Cultural Arts Division (CAD) supports the economic development, community development, and revitalization of the City by strengthening and promoting arts, culture, and creative industries for purposes of attraction and retention of businesses, preserving quality of life for residents, and cultivating tourism.

Cultural Arts Funding Program

The City of Austin provides cultural arts programs for the Austin community by contracting with arts organizations for specific services. These contracts are referred to as Cultural Services Agreements, or Cultural Contracts and are funded by Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT).







Roles and Responsibilities

Austin City Council

- Establishes overall cultural funding policy and annual program budget;
- Authorizes all contracts made under the Cultural Arts Funding Programs to arts and cultural organizations; and
- Appoints members of the Austin Arts Commission

Arts Commission

Arts Commission – Develops Funding Guidelines

Cultural Arts Division Staff

- Peer Panels Selected by CAD staff to Evaluate all proposals except Community Initiatives and Capacity Building
- Make sure applications comply with the law



Cultural Funding Program

- The Core Funding Programs offer organizational and project support to local 501c3 arts and culture organizations, as well as qualifying individual artists and organizations.
- The Community Initiatives Program offers funding to support the marketing, production, and presentation of public performances and exhibitions by nonprofits arts and culture organizations, as well as qualifying individual artists and organizations.
- The Cultural Heritage Festivals Program provides funding to local 501c3 nonprofit organizations to strengthen the marketing, production, presentation, and funding of a culturally-specific festival.
- The **Capacity Building Program** provides funding to 501c3 nonprofit arts organizations with budgets under \$200,000 and to individual artists to provide professional development opportunities that enhance and strengthen the infrastructure and workforce of Austin's creative sector.



Other Programs/Services

- TEMPO Programs allows artists to propose and create temporary public artworks in a range
 of themes suitable for the outdoor environment. It provides the opportunity for innovative,
 thought-provoking artwork that impacts the way people experience their environment, and
 invites dialogue and interaction with others.
- **NowPlayingAustin** offers an online portal for arts, culture, music and fun and is part of a national network of arts and entertainment sites.
- Zachary Scott Maintenance provides funding to support maintenance of theater.

Program Award Process

- The peer review panels are comprised of artists, arts administrators, or other individuals with a knowledge or appreciation of the arts. A slate of potential panelists is approved by the Arts Commission. Cultural Arts staff then selects panel members with the objective of having diverse panels.
- Most panelists are from Austin, with only 8 of this year's 80 panelists being from out of town.
 Panelists include members of the LGBTQ community. In Fiscal Year 17-18, EDD's Cultural Funding peer panels had an ethnic composition of 14% Asian, 28% Black, 23% Hispanic, as well as 2 multi-ethnic panelists, 1 Native American, and 1 Pacific Islander.
- The panel scores the applications but does not determine a dollar amount. Instead, scores
 high enough to receive funding (75 or above on a 100-point scale) are plugged in to a funding
 matrix to determine award amounts. The parameters of the funding matrix are voted on by
 the Arts Commission, the Cultural Funding budget is adopted by City Council as part of the
 official City budget, and then City Council approves all awards over City Manager authority
 before the new fiscal year.
