

Historical Trends

Permits, Applications, Inspections





FY2014 - FY2017

- Overall, activity has been steady
- Except, large increases in building inspections and residential



Influential Factors

Population, Jobs, and Development



Forecasted Population and Job Growth

- Continuous population growth rates (2.11% low to 2.86% high for last seven years) ¹
- 3% annual population growth forecasted through 2025 and continued growth through 2045 ¹
- 36,900 metro jobs added in 12 months ending January 2018, a 3.7% growth rate ²
- Metro jobs growth forecast: 29,800 in 2018 and 31,200 in 2019 ³

Apartments

- Occupancy down in 2017 (92.2%) compared to 2016 (93.8%) ⁴
 - Attributed to slower job growth, availability of single-family housing,
 year-over-year supply increase in apartment units for the last five years
- 114,076 apartments needed in Austin metro by 2030 to meet demand 5
 - Comparison: San Antonio metro forecasted to need 53,890 apartments by 2030
