SUBJECT:	City of Austin Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Action Plan and 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan

The purpose of this memorandum is to update Council on the City of Austin's Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2019 Action Plan and 2019-2024 Consolidated Plan. The Action Plan serves as the City's grant application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for federal funding. The 5-year Consolidated Plan is carried out through five Action Plans designed to assess affordable housing and community development needs in Austin. In order to acquire federal funding from HUD, the City must submit a both an annual Action Plan and 5-year Consolidated Plan describing activities and resources used to meet the needs of low- and moderate-income families.

The City will submit to HUD the FY 2018-19 Action Plan in August 2018. The FY 2018-19 Action Plan is the last annual plan in the FY 2014-19 Consolidated Plan and, therefore, must be in line with the initiatives and programs outlined within that Consolidated Plan.

For the City's next Consolidated Planning Process, Neighborhood Housing and Community Development Department (NHCD) staff will be reviewing all current investments for alignment with the adopted Austin Strategic Housing Blueprint and Austin Strategic Direction 2023. The enclosed analysis of current contracts shows which current contracts are most consistent with the Strategic Housing Blueprint. Additionally, NHCD will be developing a broad public engagement plan based on input from Council members about how best to reach their constituents.

For ease of reference, a preliminary FY 2019-24 Consolidated Plan timeline showing the various phases and steps involved with developing the City's Consolidated Plan has been included.
