

Hi Steve,

I am traveling right now and won't be back until 8/14, so I wanted to go ahead and submit the Certificate of Appropriateness application in case you think we need to go that route for our balcony restoration at 3912 Avenue G. We don't have dimensioned building plans, since our project is a restoration. Also, the submittal process says to get a permit first, but I'm pretty sure that doesn't apply to us either...

I am including the picture that shows the existing measurements and the details (below). We are proposing to increase the upper railing height by 4" (which is 2" higher than the existing lower railing).

Railing vertical legs	8.25"	11"	This would match the lower balcony railing
Round spacer supports	N/A	1.75"	This would match the lower balcony railing
