July 2018 ANIMAL SERVICES REPORT



Animal Services News

- The live outcome rate for July was 99.3 percent.
- A total of 808 animals were adopted (dogs, cats, and birds).
- A total of 238 dogs and cats were returned to their owners (RTOs).

Adoption Promotions

Adoption fees were waived every weekend in July to help with space challenges.

Animal Protection

- Animal Protection Officers returned 82 pets in the field.
- Officers impounded 114 injured animals.
- Officers took 223 potential rabies exposure reports.
- Implanted 10 microchips in the field.

Neighborhood Level Program

- In July, the NLP completed 108 calls.
- Pet Resource Specialists continued developing relationships with Elroy Public Library and numerous churches in the area, giving presentations and planning for community education events in the fall.

Pet Resource Center

- 86 cats participated in Spay Neuter Release (SNR) through partnership with the Austin Humane Society.
- Customer interactions offered 405 opportunities for PRC staff to provide education about pet care and resources; 57 finders were provided with flyers, scripts and supplies to aid reunification.

Enrichment


- The Behavior Team engaged 1,147 dogs in 30 playgroups for the month.
- The team evaluated 166 dogs resulting in 120 pairs made.
- Total playgroup time was 469.9 hours.
- A new playgroup record was hit with 64 dogs out in the course of one playgroup session.
- The Behavior Team created 35 pairs in the month of July through playgroups, helping immensely with space challenges.

Volunteer, Foster and Rescue Programs

- A total of 339 volunteers donated 5,254 service hours; 12 groups of volunteers donated 107 hours with their "Giving Group" to the Center; 15 community service restitution volunteers contributed 134 hours toward animal care tasks.
- Coordinators facilitated six New Volunteer Orientations, introducing 107 individuals to our organization and volunteer opportunities. Of those individuals, 25 have already begun their first volunteer shifts with mentors.
- A total of 275 families provided foster care.
- A total of 119 animals were adopted directly from foster care.
- There are 760 active fosters in GivePulse, and the team processed 111 new foster applications.
- There are currently 420 animals in 227 foster homes.
- A total of 504 live outcomes were attributed to 33 partners.

Communications

- Staff completed nine on-camera news interviews and one radio interview, regarding summer's shelter population surge.
- Highest paid engagement Facebook post about longstay dog Rocco, received more than 29 thousand views and almost 2,500 clicks.



 Highest organic engagement Facebook post about high intake numbers and waived adoption fees, received more than 75 thousand views and more than 15 thousand clicks.
