#### 4. FOR RECOMMENDATION

a) Authorize award and execution of a multi-term contract with SI Mechanical, LLC, to provide plumbing preventative maintenance, parts, installation and repair services, for up to five years for a total contract amount not to exceed \$2,750,000. (Note: This solicitation was reviewed for subcontracting opportunities in accordance with City Code Chapter 2-9C Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. For the goods and services required for this solicitation, there were insufficient subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

A motion to approve was made by Commission Member Thomas Thies motion and Commission Member Ernest Saulmon second. Motion passed on a 6-0-0-5 vote. Commission Members Frank Maldonado, Bradley Tegeler, John Walewski, and Michael Watry were absent.

b) Authorize negotiation and execution of a cooperative contract with NetSync Network

Solutions, for network switches and associated hardware, for a term of one year in an amount not to exceed \$1,510,325. (Note: This procurement was reviewed for subcontracting opportunities in accordance with City Code Chapter 2-9D Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. For the goods and services required for this procurement, there were no subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established).

A motion to approve was made by Commission Member Ernest Saulmon motion and Commission Member Jeremy Hendricks second. Motion passed on a 6-0-0-5 vote. Commission Members Frank Maldonado, Bradley Tegeler, John Walewski, and Michael Watry were absent.

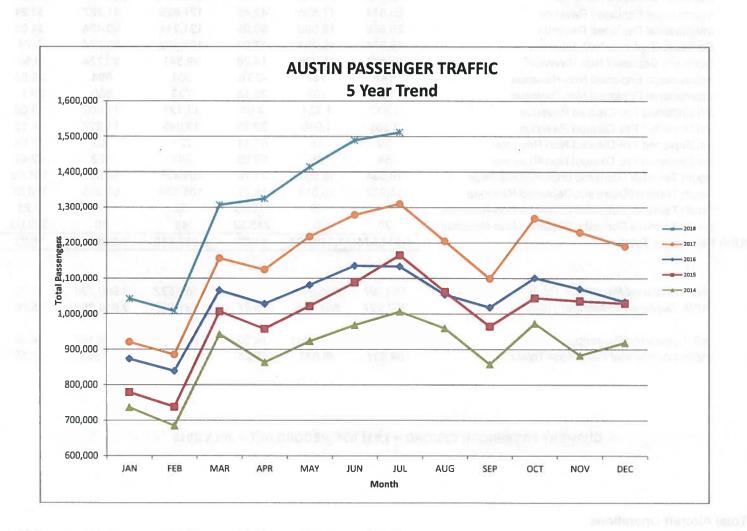
#### **ADJOURN**

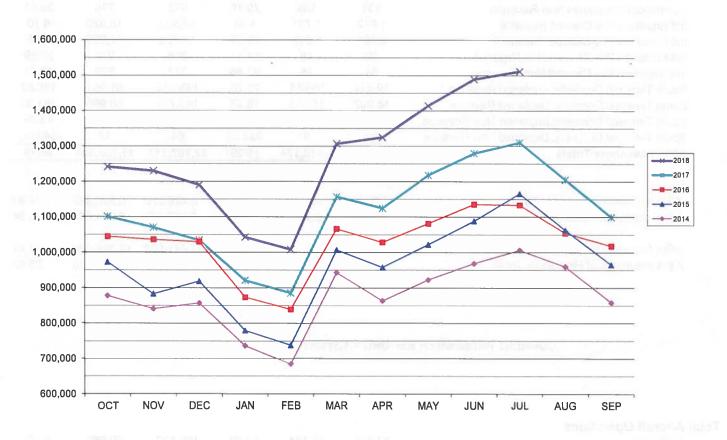

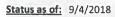

Every effort is being made by the Construction Management team to make all necessary repairs prior to the start of de-icing season. Bids for sealing of box culvert joints that transfer water from the apron to the de-Icing facility will be received on Friday, September 7th.GMP-2 Apron Expansion Part 1: Good progress is being made on completion of the first of two phased areas for expanding the existing apron and RON spaces. The same construction team working on the GMP-2 Apron Expansion will be transitioning over to the Part 2 apron expansion work area in a few months, under the final GMP-4. ## Tenant Updates and Business Development Events

- 1. On August 13, Frontier Airlines inaugurated new nonstop service between Austin-Bergstrom International Airport and Louisville, Kentucky. The new nonstop service between Austin (AUS) and the Louisville International Airport (SDF) operates on Mondays and Fridays. Scheduled flights depart AUS at 12:50 p.m. and arrive at Louisville International Airport at 4:02 p.m. Returning flights depart SDF at 4:54 p.m. and arrive at AUS at 6:05 p.m.
- 2. On August 14, Frontier Airlines inaugurated new nonstop service between Austin-Bergstrom International Airport and Orange County, California. This addition brings Frontier nonstop service to 31 destinations from Austin. The new nonstop service between Austin (AUS) and Orange County (SNA), California's John Wayne Airport will operate three times a week on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays. Flights are scheduled to depart AUS at 5:28 p.m. and arrive at John Wayne Airport (SNA) at 6:23 p.m. Return flights depart SNA at 11:48 a.m. and arrive at AUS at 4:38 p.m.
- 3. On January 18, 2018, VIA Airlines, Inc. (VIA) commenced operations at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport's South Terminal. Since commencement of operations, VIA has steadily increased the number of destinations served from Austin and through the end of September, including seasonal services, will serve 8 destinations from AUS. Options from Austin include Amarillo (AMA), Baton Rouge, Louisiana (BTR), Tulsa, Oklahoma (TUL), Little Rock, Arkansas (LIT), Oklahoma City (OKC), Tucson, Arizona (TUS), seasonal service to Branson, Missouri (BKG) and winter seasonal flights to Steamboat Springs / Hayden, Colorado (HDN). VIA's flights out of Austin are operated by 50-seat Embraer ERJ-145s. The airport has seen both positive and negative comments regarding the carrier, with those comments primarily made through social media. The airport actively monitors all complaints submitted by the public regarding our tenants, including airlines, and works with them to ensure a prompt and thorough response.

The 2015 Austin-Bergstrom International Airport Architectural and Engineering Services Rotation List currently provides professional architectural and engineering services to the City of Austin's Aviation Department in support of project needs. Work assignments are typically associated with airport building

and/or structural additions or modifications, civil or utility projects, and/or other airport-oriented specialty work. Specific task assignments include scoping, investigation, design, estimating, construction oversight, sustainability, and/or other functions as required to meet project requirements.

Austin-Bergstrom International Airport has a backlog of Capital Improvement Program projects and other developments to be assigned in the coming months that will encumber the remaining authority left on the current rotation list, but will not be enough to handle all of the anticipated projects. These projects include general aviation, planning and studies, maintenance projects as well as utility and storm water upgrades. Austin-Bergstrom International Airport continues to work with the Capital Contracting Office to create a new Aviation Architectural and Engineering Rotation List to replace the current one, however this additional authority will mitigate risk against any delays on upcoming critical projects.

The contract is for Transnorm baggage handling system parts for maintenance, maintenance training, and any repairs needed for unscheduled conveyor system failures. Austin-Bergstrom International Airport currently has a Siemens baggage conveyor system for processing and screening passenger checked luggage prior to loading on outbound aircraft and for delivering passenger luggage from inbound flights. The Siemens system incorporates 135 Transnorm power-turn conveyor sections. These sections aid passenger luggage screening operations at critical points in the baggage handling system where turns are needed to provide a smooth transition of baggage throughout the entire conveyor system.

Transnorm System Inc. is the original equipment manufacturer for the power-turn conveyor sections of the baggage handling system. Transnorm replacement parts include the belts, drive and tail rollers and maintenance training for these sections of the baggage handling system are only available through Transnorm System Inc.

The current contract expires October 18, 2018. Authorization amounts for this contract are based on departmental estimates and historical spending including an anticipated increase due to the airport expansion and anticipated upgrades.
