The vision of the project is to honor the Latino community's cultural heritage, foster a social justice consciousness and reclaim Latino collective identity in pursuit of educational freedom. The purpose is to reinforce literacy in both Spanish and English within the context of culture, history and the family. The program has been successfully implemented at the Emma S. Barrientos Mexican American Cultural Center(ESB-MACC) since 2014. Since its inception the program has met with the support and appreciation of the staff, the ESB-MACC Board and the families served.

SERVICES PROVIDED BY AISD:

- Coordination, planning, and execution of the Academia Cuauhtli Saturday Academy, which
 recruits and welcomes families from Title 1 schools. The program is provided free to parents and
 their children through Nuestro Grupo, a non-profit that coordinates community support; AISD
 supports the development of innovative curriculum that is subsequently adapted by AISD
 teachers at their school sites.
- 2. Promotion of ESB-MACC as an institution, mission, and space in marketing materials, conferences, articles, and other events when Academia Cuauhtli Saturday Academy programs are presented;
- 3. Weekly meetings to promote community engagement in a series of local initiatives related to education, community, health, art, and more;
- 4. Co-construction of professional curricula that is shared with the ESB-MACC and made available districtwide in grades 3-7, and 11;
- 5. As a program, AISD offers a variety of workshops that enhance Austinites'awareness of local opportunities, including public and higher education, as well as local community arts institutions and available opportunities for children and youth. AISD and Nuestro Grupo also provided a variety of field trips, speakers, and presentations by local artists to the students.

Lessons and instructions organized and delivered by AISD bilingual teachers to serve the following Title 1 elementary schools through Academia Cuauhtli:

- Sanchez Elementary, District 3
- Metz Elementary, District 3
- · Zavala Elementary, District 3
- Perez Elementary, District 2
- Houston Elementary, District 2

The program benefits Austin's constituents and communities by:

- Promoting bi-literacy for Austin's children, while revitalizing Spanish culture and language;
- Developing appreciation for Mexican-American and Tejano history and culture;
- Providing early, developmentally appropriate catalysts for academic achievement;
- Empowering parents to navigate the school system on their children's behalf; and
- Building a loyal constituency for ESB-MACC, the Parks Department and the City.
