ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: This budget amendment is responsive to Council Resolution 20181004-033 directing that the Historic Preservation Fund be allocated as follows: 70% for City of Austin historic facilities and sites in accordance with Texas Tax Code Section 351.101(a)(5); 15% reserved for potential future historic acquisitions or major preservation projects that would be frequented by tourists and convention delegates; and 15% to the Heritage Grant Program.
