ITEMS FROM BOARD MEMBERS

Items for Future Consideration

Board Members discussed the need for consideration of several items at upcoming meetings: Possible speed limits for bicycles on the Hike and Bike Trail, traffic crossing problems for pedestrians at Lamar and Riverside and the need for traffic control at Barton Springs Road and Stratford Drive. Ron Cartlidge moved and James Crump seconded a motion to ask the Board Chair to send a letter to Council expressing concern for pedestrian safety at the intersection of Lamar and Riverside Drive. This problem will be listed as an item for action at the March 24 meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

Board Members asked that Tommy Wood, Jim Valadez and their respective crews be commended for their hard work under extremely adverse conditions. Board Members recognize the significant contribution of these staff members in keeping the park and trail in good condition.
