**BCCP Land Management Expenditures
Resolution**

WHEREAS the Balcones Canyonlands Conservation Plan (BCCP) contemplates that the City of Austin will designate a portion of its park land to be included within the BCCP Preserve; and

WHEREAS the City of Austin Will be obliged to manage that portion of its park land in accordance with BCCP Land Management Guidelines; but

WHEREAS the BCCP Land Management Guidelines contemplate that "the preserve will offer increased public access and recreational opportunities within the Austin/Travis County area;" and

WHEREAS the City of Austin will be collecting various revenues under the BCCP;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Parks and Recreation Board recommends to the City Council that the City of Austin reserve to itself in the BCCP Plan the following rights:

1. From each Dollar of revenue generated and received by the City of Austin for management purposes, the City should retain an amount proportionate to the amount of land which it manages as part of the BCCP preserve; and

2. Of each Dollar of revenue thus retained by the City, an appropriate portion should be reserved for public use management purposes; and

3. In no event should the City of Austin be liable to pay management fees to the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department in excess of the revenue generated and received by the City of Austin for management purposes under the BCCP Plan.

(This Resolution supersedes this Board's Resolution September 28, 1993, dealing with the City's liability to Texas Parks & Wildlife for management expenses.)

**City of Austin Parkland and
the Balcones Canyonlands Conservation Plan**

WHEREAS this Board has previously recommended that the Balcones Canyonlands Conservation Plan (BCCP) should provide that the City of Austin will retain ownership and management control over all of its dedicated parkland; but

WHEREAS the revised draft of the BCCP ("Conserve As You Grow") continues to call for the inclusion of more than 2,500 acres of Austin's dedicated parkland in the BCCP preserve system; and

WHEREAS this dedicated parkland includes several much-used city parks, including the Barton Creek Greenbelt, Emma Long Park ("City Park"), Bull Creek Greenbelt and Bull Creek District Park; and

WHEREAS the revised draft also calls for the inclusion of 764 acres out of the Barton Creek Wilderness Park in the preserve system; and further calls for the use by the BCCP of \$3,700,000 in Wilderness park bond funds; and

WHEREAS the Wilderness Park bond proceeds were specifically intended by Austin voters to be used to acquire parkland separate from the preserve system to be acquired by the BCCP;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Parks and Recreation Board recommends as follows:

1. No part of the Barton Creek Wilderness Park nor its bond money should be included in the BCCP; and
2. No park tracts should be included in the BCCP preserve system unless that tract has been acquired with BCCP bond funds.

**1994-95 Operating Budget
Parks and Recreation Department**

WHEREAS the operations of the Parks and Recreation Department have been seriously underfunded for almost a decade; and

WHEREAS as a result, many playscapes and other Parks facilities have become unusable, and recreational programs have not been sufficient to provide Opportunities for Youth; and

WHEREAS the proposed cut in the PARD budget, if implemented, will result in a further decline of maintenance levels, including the elimination of PARD's Priority Response Team for maintenance; and

WHEREAS PARD's facilities and programs are vital to the quality of life in Austin, and have a direct impact on neighborhoods, families, youth, and economic growth and youth crime;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD RECOMMENDS that the 1994-95 PARD Operating Budget be increased, rather than decreased.



SUBJECT: Funding for Recreation Center at Parque Zaragoza

The Zaragoza Recreation Center project was included in Proposition 8 of the 1992 bond election. Proposition 8, which was approved by voters, authorized \$17,350,000 in bond funding for the following projects: Barton Creek Underpass, Barton Springs Rd. Bridge, Dick Nichols Park, Dove Springs Recreation Center, Garden Center Improvements, Govalle Ball Fields, Montopolis Area Sports Complex, Neighborhood Capital Account, Recreation Center Improvements, Roof Replacements, South Austin Senior Activity Center, Senior Activity Center Parking Garage, Waller Creek Hike and Bike Trail, Zaragoza Recreation Center, Zilker Hillside Theatre, Zilker Park, Zilker Playscape, and Zone 1 Land Acquisitions.

The bids for Zaragoza Recreation Center were opened on September 1, 1994; the lowest bid was \$2,380,000 which was \$600,000 over the original construction cost estimate, making it necessary to locate additional funding to award this contract. Bond covenants and Council action on this proposition allow funds to be transferred between projects. Because of the high cost per space of the proposed parking project, it is recommended that this project not be constructed at this time. Bond funding of \$600,000 was included in the estimates of Proposition 8 for the parking project and could be used for other projects in that Proposition. The proposed budget amendment would increase the bond authorization and the appropriation for the Zaragoza Recreation Center by \$600,000. The parking project could be financed if funding were available in Proposition 8 after all other projects are completed.

Your favorable recommendation to City Council of this proposal is requested.

Soccer's popularity causing headaches for league officials

The Capital Area Youth Soccer Association, the primary governing body for 30 youth soccer organizations in an area that includes Travis and seven surrounding counties, could grow this year by as much as 17 percent, said Bill Forest, president of the league.

In the previous decade, CAYSA has averaged 10 percent annual growth yearly, Forest said.

"Last year, we had 14,500 total players," he said. "I expect about 18,000 to have registered this fall. When you add the players in the spring, that will put us close to 18,000."

Forest said although the World Cup has helped the popularity of soccer grow in the United States, he thinks CAYSA's recent boom more coincides with the work of volunteers and coaches in the league.

"I don't want to discount the influence of the World Cup, but I don't want to lay it all off on that," he said. "We have some good, hard work from our volunteers and coaches who do a good job of retaining players."

"Those players then bring in their friends," Forest said. "We get a lot of people just through word of mouth."

Whatever the cause, it is bringing young players in drove to leagues such as the Northwest Austin Soccer League.

Mike Roberts, a Northwest commission-

er for the 8-and-under leagues for boys and girls, said he was expecting 40 to 60 players, but 197 players registered.

With the unexpected increase, the league has come up short on volunteers, coaches, places to play and other items.

"We started this league four weeks ago, and we just got our socks," Roberts said.

Joe Lynch, another Northwest league commissioner, got more than he bargained for in the league for players younger than 8. The league, which is in its first year, kicked off with 70 players.

"I was thinking that we would have to beg to get 30," Lynch said. "I never expected as many as we got."

Roberts said the younger age brackets are

increasing in size because younger players were somewhat affected by the World Cup hype and are not committed to a single sport.

"I think the older kids are already stuck in the sport that they are going to play in high school," Roberts said. "Also, if you are 12 years old and go and play with kids who have already played, you don't look so good."

Lynch said he expects soccer to continue to grow, largely because of the sport's year-round availability.

"Kids today are more athletically inclined," he said. "For some it's a regimen where they play sports in the fall, winter, spring and summer. Soccer offers them that."

SUBJECT: Canoe Rental Concession in Zilker Park

The City of Austin issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Canoe Rental Concession in Zilker Park, an existing concession, on March 23, 1994. One hundred ninety-four (194) notices were sent out including ten (10) MBE and six (6) WBE. Three proposals were received in response to the RFP. An evaluation team made up of representatives from the Purchasing Office, the Budget Office, the Parks and Recreation Department, the Design Commission, and the Parks and Recreation Board reviewed the responses and recommended that the contract be awarded to Austin Canoe and Kayak.

The proposals were evaluated based on the following criteria. The maximum points allowed for each are also shown. The proposals were ranked based on 900 points, i.e. 100 points for each of the nine panelists.

Based on the above criteria Austin Canoe and Kayak received the highest number of points of the three concessions.

The proposed contract is for five years with the option to extend for one additional five year period. The concessionaire will perform all normal duties associated with the operation of this type of concession. The concessionaire will provide all personnel, equipment, and products necessary to operate this concession. Canoes as well as one and two person kayaks will be available for rent.

Highlights of the proposed contract include:

- * the contractor will install and maintain an erosion control system in the concession area and along the creekbank
- * the contractor will provide type 3 (lifestyle style) lifevests to all

- participants
- * the contractor will make available, where possible, canoes and kayaks at little or not cost to non-profit groups
 - * the contractor will be responsible for replenishing gravel at the site to mitigate erosion

SUBJECT: Monument to Emmett Shelton


Several weeks ago the Parks and Recreation Department was contacted by the Public Works and Transportation Department regarding the completion of the work on the Emmett Shelton Bridge (the low water crossing bridge just downstream from the Tom Miller Dam). As part of the project, Mrs. Emmett Shelton had offered, at her expense, to erect a plaque which explains why the bridge is named for Emmett Shelton. Her intent was for it to be a 90th birthday surprise for Mr. Shelton, whose birthday will be February 12.

The attached letter and copy of the inscription were brought to the Parks and Recreation Department on November 30. The design for the monument required placement of large stones on park land adjacent to the right-of-way. Mrs. Shelton informed us that the contractor was available only a few days so she had authorized the placement of the stones. The large granite block and surrounding stones were in fact placed on Monday, November 28. The plaque has not yet been installed.

Since the infrastructure is already in place and the preliminary design had been reviewed by the Department, the Board is not asked to take any action.

There will be a dedication event in the near future, and we will be sure the Board receives invitations to this event.

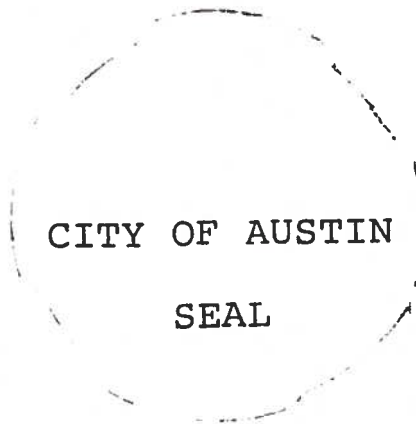


