



This letter is to affirm our support of artist Peter Struble's proposal to build a soundscape to be located in our neighborhood, possibly in the Bartholomew Park playground area. Mr. Struble has already built one award-winning soundscape for the use of Blanton Elementary School students and other neighbors. The Blanton Soundscape has made a lot of news and is a great addition to our neighborhood.

On Saturday, May 8, 1999, Mr. Struble addressed the general meeting of the Windsor Park Neighborhood Association and told us of his hope to design and build another such community musical instrument for a different part of the neighborhood. He informed the members of WPNA that he had submitted an application for a Cultural Contract with the City of Austin program that supports local artists. Because the nature of Mr. Struble's work contributes to the artistic growth and community interest of our area, we welcome his innovative idea. The WPNA members in attendance at the meeting voted to support Mr. Struble's soundscape system should it receive support from the Cultural Contracts office.



SUBJECT:

Town Lake Trail Extension

A public hearing will be held at the regular meeting of the Parks and Recreation Board on June 29, 1999, 6:30 p.m., 200 South Lamar Blvd., in the BoardRoom, on a grant application for a proposed south Town Lake Trail extension.

The extension connects the trail from the Austin American-Statesman Building to east of I.H. 35 by placing the trail on Town Lake itself. The trail extension is proposed to be a 12' wide concrete structure supported by piers approximately 25 feet off the shoreline with 3 public access points and private access points by permission only. Attached is a drawing for your information.

The grant application is scheduled to go before the City Council on July 1, 1999.
