Subject: Water Forward Task Force Resolution

## **RATIONALE:**

**WHEREAS,** Austin is one of the fastest growing regions in the country and with a rapidly growing city and a changing climate, Austin Water Utility is working with other city departments and a council appointed citizen task force to develop a water plan for the next century; and

**WHEREAS,** the goal of the Water Forward Plan is to ensure a diversified, sustainable, and resilient water future with a strong emphasis on water conservation. The plan will consider a range of strategies such as water conservation, water reuse, aquifer storage and recovery and other strategies; and

**WHEREAS**, the Austin Integrated Water Resource Planning Community Task Force was created by City Council to support development of an Integrated Water Resource Plan; and

**WHEREAS,** Austin Water led development of the Water Forward Plan, Austin's 100-year Integrated Water Resource Plan; and

## **WHEREAS,** the Plan has the following Guiding Principles:

- recognizing that Colorado River water is Austin's core supply, reinforce a strong partnership between the City and LCRA to assure reliability
- continue Austin's focus on water conservation and water use efficiency
- strengthen long-term sustainability, reliability, and diversity of Austin's water supply through maximizing local water resources
- avoid severe water shortages during times of drought
- focus on projects that are technically, socially and economically feasible
- continue to protect Austin's natural environment, including source and receiving water quality
- ensure Austin's water supply continues to meet/exceed all federal, state and local public health regulations
- align with Imagine Austin's "Sustainably Manage Our Water Resources Priority Program"
- maintain coordination and communication with regional partners
- engage the public and stakeholders throughout the plan development process; and

**WHEREAS,** Water Forward contains demand management and water supply strategy recommendations, including water conservation strategies, decentralized alternative water use strategies, use of reclaimed water, and aquifer storage and recovery; and

**WHEREAS**, through Water Forward, Austin Water will be implementing an adaptive management approach with plan updates on a five-year cycle to allow new data to inform planning assumptions.

**THEREFORE**, be it resolved that the Environmental Commission supports adoption by the City Council of the Water Forward Plan.
