 Authorize Secretary to Negotiate and Execute Contract with USFWS for Special Certificates

Joe Lessard and David Escamilla presented information about the Special Certificates. Lessard recommended approval to authorize Secretary to enter dialog with USFWS and draft an MOU between Coordinating Committee and USFWS creating Special Certificates. The Special Certificates would allow the mitigation land from individual 10(a) permits to be counted towards Preserve goal of 30,428 acres.

Mayor Bruce Todd moved to approve the authorization and Commissioner Valarie Bristol seconded the motion.

Motion passed.

Attachment outlines the main points regarding the Special Certificates. The final MOU between the CC and USFWS regarding the Special Certificates will be added to the Coordinating Committee Secretary's files upon completion and signature.

 - CC will provide USFWS access to its resources
 - USFWS will notify CC of individual mitigation land which will count towards the Preserve
 - CC will produce Special Certificates to identify the land
 - · CC will maintain record of Special Certificate acreage
 - CC will not enforce terms of individual 10(a) permits
 - Special Certificates will not impose additional restrictions on individual 10(a) permit
