#### **CURRENT POLITICAL CLIMATE**

- Anti-city environment (preempt cities roles and limit property taxes)
- Governor and Lt. Governor committed to property tax issue
- Republican lead legislature that's not changing
- Speaker's race extremely important to cities
  - 109 members have pledged to support Rep. Dennis Bonnen for Speaker

### GOVERNOR ABBOTT'S PROPERTY TAX PROPOSAL

- Jan. 16, 2018, Texans for Greg Abbott releases a "Property Tax Reform Bicentennial Blueprint
- 2.5% rollback rate to ALL taxing jurisdictions (schools)
- Cap can only be exceeded for certain expenses -- "public safety and critical infrastructure"
- Even then, only with a <u>supermajority</u> approval at council and at an election
- But can never exceed rate of statewide population growth + inflation
