

Park History



- 330 acres at 9501 FM 969 (2.5 miles east of US183)
 - Bounded by FM 969 and Colorado River
 - Approximately one mile of river frontage
 - 2/3 of property is in the 100-year floodplain
 - Adjoins Colorado/Walnut Creek Greenbelt to the west
- Purchased by PARD in 2003
- Previously used for farming and ranching



Master Plan Background and Goals



 The 2016 Parkland Events Task Force identified Treviño Metro Park as a site to study further for large events.

Funding:

- Austin Parks Foundation provided supplemental funding for park master planning.
- 2018 Bond provides funding for park development.
- Provides an avenue for the public to provide input on the vision of the park.
- PARD's desire to align park connections along the Colorado River.
- Goal of PARD's Long Range Plan to master plan all Metro Parks.

Consultant Selection Process



- October 1, 2018— Requests for Proposals issued
- November 1, 2018— Five proposals received
- Proposals evaluated and scored by 4-member team based on:
 - Applicable Company Experience and Personnel Qualifications
 - Project Work Plan and Public Engagement Plan
 - Cost Proposal
 - Local Business Presence
 - Service-Disabled Veteran Business Presence
- December 20, 2018—Evaluation team completed final scoring of proposals and identified recommended firm

PARB Action Requested & Next Steps



- Make a recommendation to City Council for the award, negotiation, and execution of a contract with the recommended offeror, Gustafson Guthrie Nichol LTD (GGN) (RFP 8600 GLB3000) to complete the John Treviño Jr. Metro Park Master Planning, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$430,150.
- Upon approval of City Council to authorize the award, negotiation and execution of a contract, PARD will seek to negotiate a contract within the project budget.
