<p>Corridor Program The 2016 Mobility Bond provides \$482 million for corridor improvement projects. Corridors are primary roadways that affect the overall transportation network. They are used for getting around, destinations for residents and visitors, and home to businesses as well as many Austinites. The 2016 Mobility Bond Corridor Program is the development, design, and construction of projects along key Austin corridors that enhance mobility, safety, and connectivity for all users—whether you drive, bike, walk, or take transit.</p>	<p>City of Austin Active Transportation Projects & Urban Trails Projects <i>(Outside of Categories Here)</i> Projects happening within the Department of Transportation executed by Active Transportation that don't fall under these other categories as well as projects under the Urban Trails Program at the City.</p>	<p>TxDOT Projects TxDOT manages many roads in Austin and has a significant impact on planning here. Most major thoroughfares are impacted by TxDOT.</p>	<p>Project Connect & Capital Metro CapMetro is our public transportation provider. Project Connect is their major transportation plan to adapt to growing population in Austin. This will also include projects that fall under the Transit Enhancement Program.</p>

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<p>CAMPO & CTRMA Projects The Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Bastrop, Burnet, Caldwell, Hays, Travis, and Williamson Counties. MPOs are federally required throughout the country in areas with a population of 50,000 or more and are required to produce a 20+ year transportation plan, called a Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), and a four-year planning document called the Transportation Improvement Program. The Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority is an independent government agency created in 2002 to improve the transportation system in Williamson and Travis counties. Governs toll roads (183A, 71, 290, MoPac Express)</p>	<p>Travis County Projects Transportation and Natural Resources (TNR) provides engineering, design, construction, and maintenance of county roads, drainage and bridges. Within County, but outside City limits most often.</p>	<p>ASMP The Austin Strategic Mobility Plan (ASMP) is Austin’s new city-wide transportation plan. They are developing this plan to make it easier to get around Austin for years to come.</p>
