

Beginning Oct. 1, 2018 all permitted food businesses in the City of Austin will be affected by Austin's Universal Recycling Ordinance which requires that businesses provide employees with on-site access to diversion of organic materials like food scraps, expired foods, and soiled paper, from local landfills.




Universal Recycling Ordinance Recycling Annual Diversion Plans

Universal Recycling Ordinance Outreach Contractors

- In 2016, the City of Austin sought proposals from qualified Contractors to provide:
 - · education and outreach services; and
 - data management services to manage, maintain, and update a dataset.
- The contract was awarded to two Contractors:
 - Concept Development and Planning, LLC (CD&P); and
 - Zero Waste Strategies, LLC.
- The contract:
 - Is authorized for \$960,000;
 - Remaining contract authority of \$438,912;
 - Expires in November 2019; and
 - Three remaining contract extensions.
- No guarantee to the Contractor of quantity of work and is assigned on an as needed basis as specified by the City.





Universal Recycling Ordinance Outreach Contractors

Projects are submitted via Project Proposal Form. Proposal forms are submitted by ARR staff to contactors or the contractors submit proposal forms to ARR staff for review and approval.

Project proposal forms seek information on:

- Project objectives

- Deliverables
- Timeline
- Staff required
- Cost impact

Projects contractors work on:

- Telephone outreach
- E-mail campaigns
- URO trainings (lunch and learns)
- Event staffing support
- Market research
