# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION FEBRUARY 25, 2019 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2019-0024 807 W. JOHANNA STREET

## **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1937 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame bungalow with a partial-width, front-gabled independent porch on stone piers and paired plain square wood posts; single, paired, and triple 1:1 fenestration.

#### RESEARCH

City building permit and utility records shows that this house was built in 1937; the first owners and occupants were George and Hallie Patterson, who lived here until around 1944. George Patterson was a floor finisher for building construction. Clyde and Thelma Jacobson rented the house in the mid-1940s; he was a warehouse man, and she worked as a saleslady at Yaring's, a ladies' department store. The house had a series of owners and renters from the late 1940s through the late 1960x, when it was purchased by Mike and Rosa Vega. Mike Vega was a carpenter. He passed away in 2016.

## STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984).

Staff has evaluated this house for designation as a historic landmark and has determined that the house does not meet the criteria for landmark designation as set forth in City Code:


- a. **Architecture.** The house is a frame 1930s bungalow with its only architectural distinction being its stone porch piers. This is a very common style of house in Austin, and does not meet the criterion for architectural significance,
- b. **Historical association**. The house was owned by a series of blue collar families, including a floor finisher, a warehouseman and his saleslady wife, and a carpenter. There do not appear to be significant historical associations.
- c. **Archaeology**. The house was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
- d. **Community value**. The house does not possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
- e. **Landscape feature**. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house does not meet the criteria for individual designation as a historic landmark.



### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:**

## George L. and Hallie Patterson (ca. 1938 – ca. 1944)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows George L. and Hallie Patterson as the owners of this house, which was worth \$2,250. George L. Patterson was 36, had been born in Texas, and was a floor sander in building construction. Hallie Patterson was 29, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had 2 children: Billie Dean, 12; and Loretta, 10. Both children were born in Texas.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows George L. Patterson as the 15-year old son of Edward W. and Mollie Patterson, who rented their home on W. Gibson Street in South Austin. George L. Patterson had been born in Texas and was the second of Edward and Mollie Patterson's 5 children. George had no occupation listed in the census report. His father, Edward W. Patterson, was a 38-year old Missouri-born farmer. His mother, Mollie Patterson, 37, had been born in Texas and was a laborer on the home farm. George's older brother, Marvin, 17, was also listed as a laborer on the home farm.

Hallie Patterson died in 1976; her last address was 306 Irma Drive in Austin. She was born in Ballinger, Texas in 1910 to Lewis G. and Addie Rampy, and was a housewife. Following Hallie's death, George L. Patterson married Dorothy E. Page in Williamson County, Texas in December, 1976. They divorced in September, 1977. He then married Bertie K. Baker in Williamson County, Texas on December 31, 1977; George and Bertie divorced in Travis County in June, 1978. George L. Patterson died in October, 1985 in Nacogdoches County, Texas. There does not appear to have been an obituary in the Austin newspapers.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Clyde and Thelma Jacobson as the owners of the house at 2315 Euclid Avenue in Austin; that house was worth \$2,500. Clyde Jacobson was 45, had been born in Illinois, and was a warehouse man for an oil products distributor. Thelma Jacobson was 35, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a daughter, Mildred Jean, 7, who had been born in Texas.
