

EXISTING CONDITIONS

- Austin Transportation, Capital Metro and the Corridor Program Office are collaborating to implement changes on Lavaca Street and Guadalupe Street, one of the highest-volume corridors in the Capital Metro system
- Severe bus delay occurs at Lavaca Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard
- Currently, northbound buses are routed along Lavaca Street, until Martin Luther
 King Jr. Boulevard when bus operators must turn right or left
- Left-hand turns are cumbersome at Lavaca Street/Martin Luther King Jr.
 Boulevard, particularly during peak hours
- Despite attempts to improve operations with a transit-priority lane, bus signal, and other infrastructural components, bus operations have continued to experience delay





PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS

- To address operational challenges, Austin Transportation and Capital Metro will implement routing and infrastructure improvements this year, including a contraflow lane on Guadalupe Street between 18th Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard
- These improvements are included in the Corridor Program
 Office's City Council-approved Corridor Construction Program,
 and are being expedited and constructed this year as a "first
 out" project


